#### \*Instructions for Public Comment During Hybrid Meetings

During hybrid meetings, members of the public may address the CSW as follows:

- \*Written Comments: Written public comments may be emailed in advance of the meeting. Please read the following instructions carefully:
- 1. Your written comment should be emailed to tbeat@smcgov.org.
- 2. Your email should include the specific agenda item on which you are commenting or note that your comment concerns an item that is not on the agenda or is on the consent agenda.
- 3. Members of the public are limited to one comment per agenda item.
- 4. The length of the emailed comment should be commensurate with the two minutes customarily allowed for verbal comments, which is approximately 250-300 words.
- 5. If your emailed comment is received by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, it will be provided to the CSW and made publicly available on the agenda website under the specific item to which your comment pertains. If emailed comments are received after 5:00p.m. on the day before the meeting, the staff will make every effort to either (i) provide such emailed comments to the CSW and make such emails publicly available on the agenda website prior to the meeting, or (ii) read such emails during the meeting. Whether such emailed comments are forwarded and posted, or are read during the meeting, they will still be included in the administrative record.

  - Dr. Ana Avendaño, born and raised in SMC. Lives in Redwood City with her family. Has her doctorate. She is the Executive Director of El Concilio.

  - Immigrated from Venezuela and started her career in banking.
  - Very little progress with investing in women's businesses.
  - Women-owned businesses in SMC are primarily in education, healthcare, social assistance and professional services
  - Accion Opportunity Fund provides the capital and loans for these small businesses. Not just funding but coaching, mentoring, and resources for navigating their businesses.
  - Been around 30 years and headquartered in San Jose. 70% of the lending happens in CA.
  - They have deployed 5 million of capital in SMC. Mostly in service industry.
  - Build a lender's file to help underwrite their funding.

#### Feedback Facilitators

**Goal at Tables:** Receive their feedback on the topic of the wealth gap and access to childcare.

**3 Options:** share verbally their thoughts to each question; write down their thoughts on paper; write down their thoughts with their smartphones.

## Provide Structure:

- No interrupting the person who is speaking
- Offer "pass," "pause," or "participate"

- Avoid judgement or reacting
- Ask people to raise hand to share or do "round robin"; give people parameters for how much time they have to share.

# **Facilitation Tips:**

- Active Listening: listen for understanding rather than responding. Be present, have eye contact; reflect back what you heard
- Awareness of Others' behavior: notice body language; side conversations; ask to bring people's attention back to the speaker.
- Essence of Thought: ask for the most important point of the matter; the key take-aways.


