- Resource Roadmap for the Trans and Non-Binary Community in San Mateo County; March 31st from 6-8pm
 - This interactive workshop is intended to serve as a guide to help transgender and non-binary community members in San Mateo County learn how to find, access, and navigate the different networks of resources available. Led by our Lead Case Manager, Alex Golding (he/him), we will review tips and tricks relevant to San Mateo County and cover the following topics: finding and maintaining safe, affordable housing; navigating the healthcare system to find gender-affirming providers for both physical and mental health; finding work and identifying trans-affirming employers; knowing your rights and accessing legal resources (e.g. name and gender change); and more!
