LAFCo File No. 04-12---Proposed Extension of Sewer Service by the City

of Redwood City to 970 Upland

### Summary

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56133, Commission approval is required for extension of service by local agencies to territory outside of the agency's boundaries. This section requires that the public agency apply to LAFCo by resolution on behalf of the landowner. In this case, the City of Redwood City has applied for extension of sewer service for a single family dwelling in unincorporated Oak Knoll area (Emerald Hills). The project area is within the sphere of influence of the City of Redwood City. Commission approval is recommended.

### **Departmental Reports**

### Environmental Health:

The City of Redwood City provides water and sewer service in the area. The Countygoverned Oak Knoll Sewer Maintenance District also provides sewer service in unincorporated area. Sewer service is recommended because evidence of a failed septic system is evident on the property.

### Assessor

The subject parcel is assessed at \$592,996.

### Election's Division

There are no registered voters in the subject territory.

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### San Mateo County Public Works

The County-governed Oak Knoll Sewer Maintenance District serves a portion of the unincorporated area, however the District does not have sewer lines adjacent to this parcel. Requiring the property owner to annex to the District does not appear a reasonable course of action given the proximity of the City sewer lines and the City limit. However, there are instances where property served by the District is directly tied into facilities of the City of Redwood City. It also appears that the City sewer line that would serve this property is within unincorporated portion of Upland Road, and therefore annexation of the property and the portion of Upland Road to the City of Redwood City is recommended.

### Staff Report and Recommendation:

This application has been submitted by resolution of the City of Redwood City on behalf of the property owner in order to receive sewer service and obtain a San Mateo County building permit for a proposed single-family residence under San Mateo County permit and design standards. San Mateo County Environmental Health has determined that the existing septic system cannot be repaired and the City indicates that service is available can be provided via the sewer main in Upland. The County-governed Oak Knoll Sewer Maintenance District provides sewer service to the surrounding unincorporated areas, however does not have sewer lines in proximity to the property.


As is the case with all of Unincorporated Emerald Hills and Oak Knoll neighborhoods, the property is in the sphere of influence of the City of Redwood City and in this case is adjacent to City of Redwood City boundaries and eligible for annexation. Consistent with San Mateo LAFCo's policies on extension of service outside jurisdictional boundaries, upon receiving inquiries regarding City extension of sewer service to the property, LAFCo staff worked with the property owner and the City of Redwood City on annexation in lieu of extension of sewer service outside City boundaries. While the City of Redwood City is willing to provide sewer service to the property, it is not willing to annex the property at this time. Staff believes that requiring the property owner to annex to the Oak Knoll Sewer Maintenance District and construct a sewer main past other properties to connect to the Oak Knoll System would not be a logical or reasonable alternativegiven the proximity of the City of Redwood City sewer line.

The current Commission policy and Government Code Section 56133 do not prohibit extension of sewer service by the City. The Commission may wish to revisit the policy to determine whether changes are necessary to provide more guidance for the San Mateo County Planning and Building Division and cities to encourage early consultation by property owners to pursue development in Cities, rather than the County.

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**Recommendation:** The proposal is consistent with the City's sphere of influence. Staff has worked with the City of Redwood City and the property owner to encourage annexation. At this time, the City proposes extension of sewer service without annexation because the proposed, in-progress construction is pursuant to County permit and design standards. Based on these circumstances, extension of sewer service to the property by the City of Redwood City provides the most logical and efficient delivery of service. Staff therefore respectfully recommends approval of the extension of sewer service by the City of Redwood City to 970 Upland.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 14605**

### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEWER CONNECTION PERMIT TO 970 UPLAND ROAD

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo Environmental Health Office has determined that the existing septic sewer system servicing the real property located at 970 Upland Road is not functioning properly and poses a threat to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the above-described real property is within the unincorporated area of San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo has no sewer system servicing this area; and

WHEREAS, the Uniform Plumbing Code prohibits repairs to existing septic sewer systems when an existing sewer line is within two hundred (200') feet of the property; and


WHEREAS, the property owners of the above-described property have requested connection to the City's sewer line; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.53 Inter-Area Connections of the Municipal Code allows for such sewer connections with the consent of the City Council; and

WHEREAS, Section 27.101 Wastewater Treatment Capacity Fee; requires fees to be paid by the property owner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

- City Manager or his designee is authorized to issue a sewer connection permit(s) for the premises located at 970 Upland Road, as there exists exceptional and extraordinary conditions affecting such premises.
- 2. Further, as a condition precedent to the issuance of said permits(s), the City Manager or his designee is further authorized to require the payment by the property owners of 970 Upland Road, of all sewer fees as may be applicable and authorized by the Redwood City Municipal Code or Resolutions adopted by this City Council.
- 3. City Manager or his designee, submit an application to the Local Agency Formation Commission for such sewer connection.


