The San Mateo County Parks Department manages 23 parks and 200 miles of trails that exemplify the rich diversity of our county's natural and recreational spaces. Our parks include a marine reserve, a bayside recreational area, neighborhood picnic areas and rugged forest trails. We're proud to serve 3 million park visitors every year.



The Park Aide Position

As an aide you'll work alongside park rangers to provide recreational opportunities to the community and protect our county's environmental resources. Common duties include facility maintenance, custodial work, basic carpentry, gardening, trail maintenance, building and grounds maintenance, record keeping, interpretation, interacting with park visitors and gatehouse cashiering.

While it's helpful to be familiar with the tools used in these jobs, on-job training can be provided; the most important quality you can bring is the desire to serve the public and learn new skills. This is an excellent opportunity to gain park experience and start a career.

Compensation & Work Hours

Park Aides earn between \$17.99 and \$22.51 an hour. Compensation includes overtime and holiday pay. Medical and other benefits may be available in accordance with the County agreement with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME). The basic Park Aide uniform and safety equipment are provided by the Department.

Park Aides work no more than 1,040 hours during a fiscal year (July 1 through June 30). Schedules vary and may include evenings, weekends and holidays. Park Aides often work seasonally between April and October and may be scheduled to work less than 40 hours per week.
