Supervisor's Report, presented by Maggie Cornejo, Legislative Aid

- The Board of Supervisors passed a District 4 Measure K grant to help fund the Healthy Community Mural Project that will be placed on the Fifth Avenue underpass, the project will include 16 murals from local artists and professionals. A survey will be sent out to the NFO community in August to ask for input
- The Board of Supervisors approved the revised Flood Park Landscape Plan, received 800 surveys from the community, plan will move forward and renovations to begin soon

County Executive's Report, presented by Justin Mates, Deputy County Manager

- Small Business Grant Program to award 100 businesses in North Fair Oaks who have been greatly impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. Currently 43 businesses have received the grant
- Middlefield Rd Improvement Project continues, sidewalks are now completed from Pacifica to Berkshire. Visit the county's website to view the schedule and progress of the construction
- New Farmworker Advisory Commission to launch, applications now open for vacant seats, recruiting farmworkers, community-based organizations, and family members of farmworkers
- An RFP has been issued for a consultant to conduct a 10-year review of the North Fair Oaks Community Plan, NFOCC members to sit on the interview panel
