Background

- LPRs First Used by Sheriff's Office 2013
- Vehicle Mounted or Trailer - Motorola
- City of San Carlos and Portola Valley - Fixed Mounts 20+

Flock Camera

- First used by the Sheriff's Office 2020
- Currently in Millbrae, San Mateo, Atherton, and many cities
- Quick and easy move
- 30-day retention

LPR Policy

- Lexipol Policy 420
- ALPR Data retained for 1 year. Unless requested different (30 days) for Flock
- Users must be trained and acknowledge policy
- Added plate data will expire after 30 days

Steps to Search?

- Staff must be trained
- System log on multiple layers of security
- Case Number
- Purpose – Active Investigation
- Reason for Search

Success Stories

- Deputies were alerted to a stolen vehicle and where able to locate the vehicle and arrest the driver who was wanted for more serious crimes (attempted murder)
- Patrol was able to track robbery/shooting suspect to Hayward and make arrest
- Detectives were able to identify a burglary suspect vehicle and link them to a series of home burglaries in Ladera area.
- Deputies were alerted to a carjacking vehicle in San Carlos and were able to locate the vehicle and arrest two suspects.
