Health Care For Homeless Veterans (HCHV)

Emergency Housing

The Health Care for Homeless Veterans (HCHV) program provides emergency housing for homeless Veterans at a non-VA community-based facility.

While in the program, Veterans receive case management, treatment, and recovery services to aid with searching for permanent housing. HCHV provides services to single men, women, and families with children. HCHV also has a specialized program that focuses on the Geriatric populations, Medical Respite and 290. There is no program fee, but Veterans may be asked to save a portion of their income to help secure permanent housing.

Grant And Per Diem (GPD) Transitional Housing

The Grant and Per Diem (GPD) program provides transitional housing and supportive services for homeless Veterans at a non-VA community agency. GPD offers services to single men, women, and families with children. Supportive services include case management, financial planning education, crisis intervention, counseling, and group activities.

Veterans with income may be expected to contribute up to 30 percent of their income as a program fee. GPD programs are operated by community-based organizations and function independently from the VA.
