Business (Continued)	<ul> <li>Community Care: Helping Veterans Navigate the Healthcare System</li> <li>For VA reimbursement the following is required- Veteran is enrolled in VA health system.</li> <li>The medical situation is of such a nature that a prudent layperson would reasonably expect that a delay in seeking immediate medical attention would be hazardous to life or health.</li> <li>VA must be notified within 72 hours of treatment.</li> <li>Generally, emergency treatment is only covered until such time as the Veterar can be safely transferred to a VA or other federal facility.</li> <li>There are limitations to the VA ability to provide coverage when you have other health insurance.</li> <li>Notifying VA in a timely fashion is important because this:</li> <li>Allows VA to assist the Veteran in coordinating necessary care or transfer, helps ensure that the administrative and clinical requirements for VA to pay for the care are met and may impact a Veteran's eligibility for VA to cover the cost of emergency treatment.</li> </ul>

Business (Continued)	<ul> <li>COMPACT ACT-January 17, 2023, VA will pay for, provide, or reimburse emergency care for certain Veterans and individuals—including ambulance transportation cost.</li> <li>Eligibility for COMPACT ACT: Former member of armed forces who were discharged or release under conditions other than dishonorable after more than 24 months of active service, who served more than 100 days under a combat exclusion or support of a contingency operation either directly or by operating unmanned aerial vehicle, members of armed forces who were victims or physical assault of a sexual nature or harassment while serving.</li> <li>Emergency Care should always be the first consideration.</li> <li>Veterans not enrolled in VA healthcare may not be able to see reimbursement through VA unless; covered under COMPACT ACT, subsequent service connection and issue related to SC claim.</li> <li>Veteran covered under the PACT ACT who are not otherwise eligible have until Aug 10, 2023, to apply for VHA</li> </ul>
