**\*Spoken Comments In Person:**

1. As with all public comment in person, members of the public who wish to address the Members of the North Fair Oaks Community Council in the Multipurpose Room should complete a speaker's slip to make a public comment. Speakers will be called to the stand in the order their speaker slip was received. Each speaker will have two minutes to speak for each agenda item.

**\*Spoken Comments Via Teleconference (Zoom):**

4. When the North Fair Oaks Community Council Chair or Clerk calls for the item on which you wish to speak, click on “raise hand.” Speakers will be notified shortly before they are called to speak. Each speaker will have two minutes to speak for each agenda item.

**\*Written Public Comment:**

Written public comments may be emailed in advance of the meeting, and such written comments should indicate the specific agenda item on which you are commenting. Please read the following instructions carefully:

1. Your written comment should be emailed to [communityaffairs@smcgov.org](mailto:communityaffairs@smcgov.org).
2. Your email should include the specific agenda item on which you are commenting or note that your comment concerns an item that is not on the agenda.
3. Members of the public are limited to one comment per agenda item.
4. The length of the emailed comment should be commensurate with the two minutes customarily allowed for verbal comments, which is approximately 250-300 words.
5. If your emailed comment is received by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, it will be provided to the Members of the Council. The Clerk will make every effort to read emails received after that time but cannot guarantee such emails will be read during the meeting, although such emails will still be included in the administrative record.
