*Instructions for Public Comment During Hybrid Meetings

- *Written Comments: Written public comments may be emailed in advance of the meeting. Please read the following instructions:
- 1. Your written comment should be emailed to tbeat@smcgov.org.
- 2. Your email should include the specific agenda item on which you are commenting or note that your comment concerns an item that is not on the agenda or is on the consent agenda.
- 3. Members of the public are limited to one comment per agenda item.
- 4. The length of the emailed comment should be commensurate with the two minutes customarily allowed for verbal comments, which is approximately 250-300 words.
- 5. If your emailed comment is received by 5:00 p.m. on the day before the meeting, it will be provided to the LGBTQ Commission and made publicly available on the agenda website under the specific item to which your comment pertains. If emailed comments are received after 5:00p.m. on the day before the meeting, the staff will make every effort to either (i) provide such emailed comments to the LGBTQ Commission and make such emails publicly available on the agenda website prior to the meeting, or (ii) read such emails during the meeting. Whether such emailed comments are forwarded and posted, or are read during the meeting, they will still be included in the administrative record.

*Spoken Comments: In person Participation:

- 1. If you wish to speak to the LGBTQ Commission, please fill out a speaker's slip. If you have anything you wish distributed to the LGBTQ Commission and included in the official record, please provide to staff who will distribute it to commissioners. Via Teleconference (Zoom):

- 4. When the Co-chair or staff calls for the item on which you wish to speak, click on "raise hand." Speakers will be notified shortly before they are called to speak.
