6. Update on the Affordable and Quality Healthcare Ad-Hoc committee and motion to approve workplan

Members of the Affordable and Quality Healthcare Ad-Hoc committee include Vice-chair Corina Rodriguez Perez, Rogelio Nabor-Martinez, Yolanda Guzman Calderon, Yesenia Garcia. The final goal of the committee is to raise the income limit for the San Mateo County's health insurance; Access and Care for Everyone (ACE) program. The minimum wage for farmworkers in the south coast is \$16.50. The yearly income for couples is approximately \$68,000 meanwhile the income limit for a household of 2 for ACE is \$39,440. To achieve their goal, the committee plans to create a campaign to present to the Board of Supervisors First step is for everyone to learn more about the ACE program such as: What the program does Who funds the program. Searching for similar programs in the County that have higher income requirements. Will use the Department of Housing income and rent limit chart as an example to support their reasoning for increasing the income requirement for the ACE program. Next, they will seek the support from farmworkers and organizations from the coastal region.
