






#### **Existing Parking Issues**

- Curb painting




#### The Numbers

# of parking complaints received

 Approximately 6,000 Parking related complaints (Police Department)

 Approximately 9,000 Parking related complaints (Public Works Services Departments)

### Permit Program Background

On-street parking is a limited City resource and at times requires management


to help create availability.

- Management of parking can:
  - Reduce congestion
  - Improve parking turnover
  - Reduce illegal parking and abandonment of vehicles
  - Increase public safety
- First permit area adopted in 1985
  - Most recent adopted in 2018
- 4 adopted areas
  - Sequoia Hospital
  - Sequoia High School
  - Stambaugh/Heller Neighborhood
  - Friendly Acres Neighborhood





#### Permit Parking Zones





#### Permit Program Details

- Requires wide neighborhood support
  - Petition of 50% addresses in area
  - Area must show severe parking impact, avg on-street occupancy over 80%
  - City-issued survey, require 25% response with at least 67% in support.
- Program allows for 2-hr parking
- Must renew annually
- Limit 3 permits per address, eight 1-day guest permits per year, and two 14-day guest permits per year.
- Typical hour of restrictions 7 am-6 pm, Mon-Fri





# Residential Permit Parking Considerations

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CITY OF REDWOOD CITY

- 1. Is there wide support for a program?
- 2. What kind of impacts is the neighborhood experiencing?
- 3. Do you want restrictions during evening hours and weekends, when most residents are home
- Program may have impacts on the following residential situations:
  - Residents with multiple vehicles for one property
  - Home-base businesses
  - Garage not used for parking
  - Inoperable vehicles, boats, and RVs
  - Multiple families in single-family homes
- 5. What kind of enforcement is available and what are the enforcement expectations?
