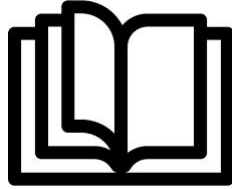

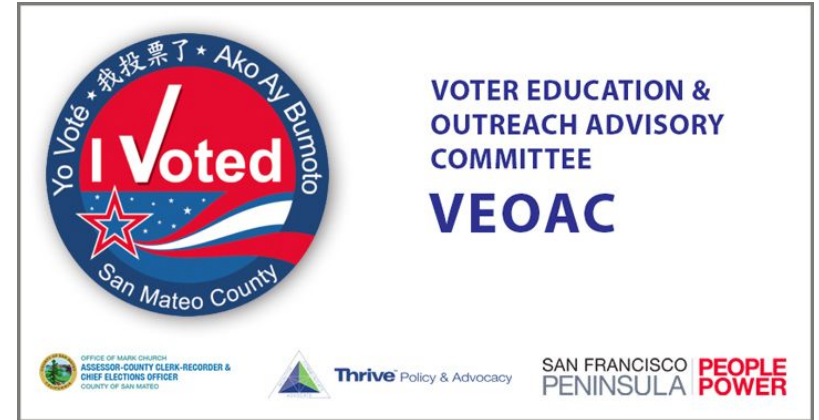

Election Toolkit

WHY vote?

HOW will I vote: mail or in person?

MAIL YOUR POSTAGE-PAID BALLOT BACK
No lines! No problem. Mail your ballot back using the postage-paid envelope provided by Election Day, Tuesday, June 7.

DROP OFF YOUR BALLOT
You can drop off your mail ballot at any Drive-Through or Vote Center.

VOTE IN PERSON
You can vote in person at any Vote Center. In addition, you can do the following:
- Drop off your completed ballot
- Use an accessible voting machine
- Register to vote
- Get language assistance

REMOTE ACCESSIBLE VOTE BY MAIL (RAVBM)
Mark your ballot and print it from your computer.
Mail or take your printed ballot to a Ballot Drop Box or Vote Center.

YOUR VOTE COUNTS
Voting is a way to have your voice heard.

All votes matter. In 1983 East Palo Alto was incorporated as a city with just 15 voters. In 2005, San Mateo Measure Y passed by 43 votes. Some city council races have been decided by just 20 votes! Your vote can sway an election.

WHEN to vote?
Important Dates

Mon, May 9
You can begin voting at any Vote Center or mail your ballot.

Mon, May 9
Three vote centers will open.

Sat, May 28
Nine vote centers will open.

Sat, June 4 – Tues, June 7
All forty-five vote centers will be open.

Tues, June 7
Last day to vote. If a vote by mail ballot is postmarked on or before Tues, June 7 and is received by the County Elections officials by Tues, June 7, it will be counted.

WHO is eligible to vote?

- A United States citizen and a resident of California
- 18 years old or older on Election Day
- Not currently serving a state or federal prison term for the conviction of a felony
- Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court

WHAT will be on my ballot?

A Ballot Will Be Mailed to All Registered Voters.

CONSEJOS PARA SOLICITAR ASISTENCIA DE FEMA PARA INDIVIDUOS Y HOGARES

1 ENTREGUE SU SOLICITUD ANTES DEL 16 DE MARZO

Si vive en el condado de San Mateo, entregue su solicitud antes del 16 de marzo para ser elegible para la asistencia de FEMA. Incluso si cree que su seguro podría cubrir sus daños, o si tiene dudas sobre la elegibilidad, es mejor solicitar la asistencia de FEMA para mejorar la posibilidad de satisfacer sus necesidades. Si no tiene un número de seguro social, aún puede solicitar asistencia de FEMA a través de su hijo/hija ciudadano/a menor en el hogar.

2 SI SE LE INDIQUE, APLIQUE PARA UN PRÉSTAMO DE LA SBA

Si se le aprueba un préstamo de la Administración de Pequeñas Empresas (SBA), no tiene que aceptarlo. Si se le niega un préstamo de la SBA, FEMA reevaluará su caso para determinar qué nivel de asistencia financiera puede brindarle.

3 APELE SU CASO

Puede apelar una decisión de FEMA dentro de los 60 días de haber recibido la carta de decisión de FEMA. Si no cumple con la fecha límite de apelación, apele de todos modos con una explicación en su carta de por qué no cumplió con la fecha límite.

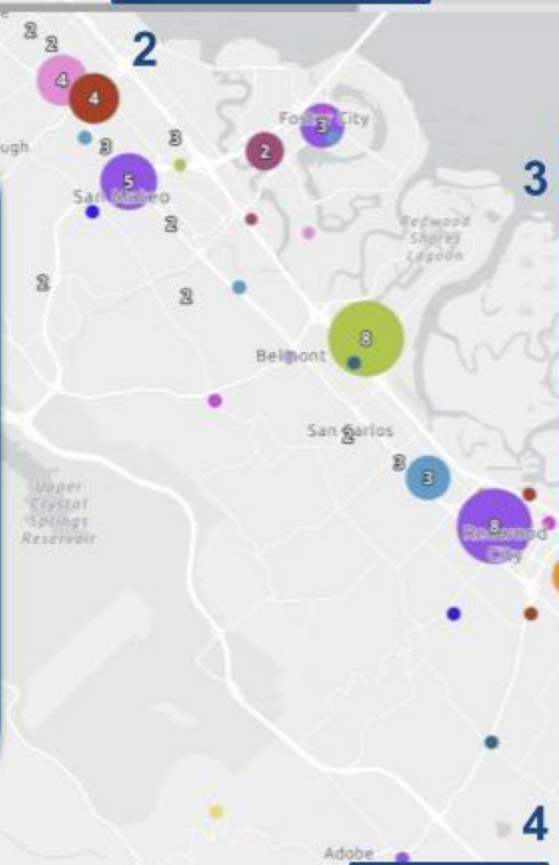
1 Search for Service or Provider
