Rebecca Carabez January 8, 2024

- 1. **Proposal:** Inquiry on the status of care for LGBTQ youth in foster care in Child Welfare Services in San Mateo County
 - a. It is estimated that 19% of the youth (age 12-21 years) in the US foster care system identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual and/or transgender (LGBT).
 - b. LGBT youth are disproportionately represented in foster care approximately 1.5 to 2 times as many LGBT youth living in foster care as LGBT youth estimated to be living outside of foster care
 - c. While in foster care, they may also experience discrimination, intimidation and bullying.
 - d. LGBTQ youth are more likely to be hospitalized for emotional (depression, mood disorders and suicidality)
 - e. What role can the LGBTQ Commission play in advocating for LGBTQ kids in foster care? What could the LGBTQ Commission do to support foster care providers?
- 2. **6 month Goal:** Inquire on the following information for LGBTQ+ youth in San Mateo County Child Welfare Services
 - a. number of foster youth (12-21 years)- number of LGBTQ+ youth
 - b. Data collected in CWS forms- Does San Mateo County Child Welfare collect SOGI data?
 - c. Housing options available- How can foster care providers be supported?
 - d. Support services available- Are there services tailored for LGBTQ kids in foster care?
 - e. Medical services available

3. Project Details

- a. January 2024: Formal inquiry to Child Welfare Services on a) through e)
- b. January-March: Data collected from Child Welfare Services
- c. March-June: Review data collected and discuss inquiries c through e.

Craig Wiesner Proposal

Overall Idea: Get the San Mateo County History Museum to help curate, create, and feature a San Mateo County LGBTQIA+ History Exhibit.

Goal: To gather the stories and artifacts from and make historic figures and events in LGBTQIA+ history visible to visitors to the museum during Pride Month.

Steps:

- Seek information on anyone/orgs that may already have been working on this idea for our county and meet with people/orgs to learn more.
- Meet with Ken Yeager to learn about how he and his team created the San Jose LGBTQ+ History Museum Exhibit
- Meet with museum leaders to discuss the idea and learn if there is interest in the idea and if so establish a series of steps/tasks that need to take place to get the idea moving (this may include the need to find funding sources)
- Enlist volunteers to help accomplish the steps needed
- Establish criteria which would determine when enough has been accomplished to plan a launch date for the exhibit
- Create an event to celebrate the launch

LGBTQIA+ Commission Proposal 2024

From: LGBTQIA+ Commissioner Dana TherActivist Johnson (they/ them/ he) Date: January 8, 2024

Format

- 1. Overall idea: Example Year-round Visibility; Propose social media campaign called "Everyday Queers"
- 2. Goal: Example to raise the profile of LGBTQIA+ residents and highlight members in every city in the County.
- 3. Then you'll write an outline of HOW the project can be done by the Commission for 2024. It would include a start date, what do you need to begin the project, what the commission does, and what happens in each month of the year along with a completion date.

Proposal

1.) Idea:

Implement SOGIE intake questions in all County involved Housing centers, sites and programs. Identify a number of rooms/ housing spaces allocated for LGBTQIA+ houseless community members in the San Mateo County Housing Navigation Center and various San Mateo County Housing residential sites.

2.) Goal:

- To provide an equitable lens for houseless LGBTQIA+ community members in County ran programs and community resources
- Enhance and Promote a Diversity Equity Inclusion and Belonging protocol when intaking LGBTQIA+ community members into County services and programs
- Promote LGBTQIA+ houseless resources and support on Health County Van

Marilyn Hollinger

I want the county to provide resources to schools to support LGBTQIA+ students. But we can't know what kind of support to offer without knowing what schools provide. So I would like to suggest that we target all high schools and middle schools in the county and send a brief questionnaire to them to get an idea of what is in place at their school, and follow up with a brief interview to get to details that are hard to get in a questionnaire. The result would be recommendations to the Board of Supervisors to support LGBTQIA+ students in our county schools.

Sample questions

Do you have a club or other group for LGBTQIA+ students? Does it jeet regularly? How many students attend? Does it have a faculty sponsor? What kind of content is contained in your sex education classes about LGBTQIA+ people? What kind of training do your school counselors have regarding LGBTQIA+ youth? What is contained in your policies around dealing with LGBTQIA+ students? What is the content of schoolwide events (like a Pride celebration) that explicitly include discussion of or events around LGBTQIA+ people or topics? What kinds of issues have you had in dealing with the subject of LGBTQIA+ students? What specific activities or policies or resources do you wish you had to support your LGBTQIA+ students?

Generally people answering questions like this give short answers (hey, we're all busy!), so the follow-up would be to get more information.

8 high schools, need to finalize the list of middle schools from <u>here</u>. We could start with the high schools because of the relatively small number, and see how the project goes.

Some possible types of support that the Board of Supervisors might be able to provide are organizational and financial resources for education material, speakers bureaus, staff training materials.

I hope this is enough to get a discussion going.
