Action Minutes San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission Meeting January 17, 2024

Chair Draper called the Wednesday, January 17, 2024 meeting of the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) to order at 2:30 pm at the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors Chambers, 400 County Center, Redwood City, CA. Members of the public were also able to participate in the meeting remotely via Zoom.

1. Roll Call

2. Public Comment for Items Not on the Agenda

None

3. Appointment of Chair and Vice Chair for 2024

<u>Commission Action</u>: Commissioner Chang-Kiraly motioned to move item 3 to later in the agenda to allow Commissioners Martin and Mueller to participate in the appointment of Chair and Vice Chair. Commissioner Rarback seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by roll call vote (Ayes: Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper).

4. Consent Agenda

- a) Approval of Action Minutes: November 15, 2023
- b) Time Extension for LAFCo File No. 19-03 Proposed annexation of 252 Club Drive, Unincorporated San Mateo County (APN 049-050-050) to the City of San Carlos

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<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Chang-Kiraly moved to approve the consent agenda. Commissioner Bigstyck seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper)

5. Consideration of LAFCo File No. 20-10: Proposed annexation of APNs 046-032-030, 046-32-040, 046-032-080, 046-032-090, and associated right-of-way to the City of Belmont from unincorporated San Mateo County and detachment from the Harbor Industrial Sewer Maintenance District (HISMD) and Belmont Highway Lighting District (BHLD)

Commissioner Mueller arrived at 2:37pm. Commissioner Martin arrived at 2:40pm.

Rob Bartoli, Executive Officer, provided an overview of the project at 608 Harbor Blvd, which proposes to annex 4 parcels in the Harbor Industrial Area into the City of Belmont and detach those parcels from the HISMD and BHLD. The project also proposes to consolidate the 4 parcels into a 0.71-acre lot that will be that will be developed into a 5-story, multi-family residential building. Services, such as police, streets and storm water management, sewer, street lighting and parks, will transfer from the County to the City of Belmont, and the resulting property tax exchange has been approved by both the County Board of Supervisors and the Belmont City Council. The City of Belmont is the lead agency for CEQA. Mr. Bartoli reviewed several factors to be considered for applications for annexations. Based on those findings, staff recommended that the Commission approve the proposal for annexation and certify that the Belmont Village Specific Plan Environmental Impact Report and addendum for the Windy Hill Project prepared by the City of Belmont as leady agency is within the responsibility of the City of Belmont and not of San Mateo LAFCo.

Chair Draper inquired about the sewer laterals in the area. Carlos de Melo, the Community Development Director for the City of Belmont, confirmed that the sewer connection would occur at Elmer Street and O'Neill Avenue.

Commissioners Rarback and Bigstyck noted the inclusion of affordable housing in the project proposal and commented on the need for more affordable housing, as well as more housing at varying income levels.

Chair Draper opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received.

<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Mueller moved to approve LAFCo File No. 20-10. Commissioner Chang-Kiraly seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper, Mueller, Martin)

6. Broadmoor Police Protection District Update

Mr. Bartoli presented an update on the Broadmoor Police Protection District (BPPD). On December 1, 2023, the County Treasurer-Tax Collector transferred District funds from the County Investment Pool to an independent bank account. District staff presented a financial update that was presented at the BPPD Commission Meeting on January 9, 2024. The update

noted that BPPD staff has been reduced to full-time officers only but did not state the number of current full-time officers. The update also noted that while payroll is lower year-to-date in FY 24 compared to FY 23, insurance and legal costs continue to rise. Finally, the District Commission did not move to contract with a consulting firm to support the District with their proposed ballot measure.

Chair Draper asked about the status of the response matrix regarding recommendations for BPPD. LAFCo staff responded that it has not been updated since it was received in July 2023.

Commissioner Rarback commented that every update regarding the Broadmoor Police Protection District is bad news and that it is problematic that the district can continue to exist given its condition.

Chair Draper opened public comment. Andrea Hall, Broadmoor resident, thanked the Commission for its continued attention to the issue. Ms. Hall stated that she would appreciate any step LAFCO can take to keep the District accountable. Char Draper closed the comment period.

Commissioner Bigstyck noted the District's lack of transparency and stated that it is not clear if any work has been done to improve the situation.

Commissioner Martin asked Mr. Bartoli what the Commissions options are. Mr. Bartoli responded that it would be challenging for LAFCo to initiate dissolution because staff would be tasked with preparing a plan for service, which would require collaboration with the County and Sherriff's office and their willingness to provide service.

Chair Draper suggested initiating an MSR of the District to provide an updated, comprehensive analysis of the state of the District. Commissioner Chang-Kiraly agreed and stated that it is LAFCo's responsibility to collect information and impart it to the public.

Commission Mueller asked several questions about District's Commission agendas and transparency. Regarding the District's risk for insolvency, Commissioner Mueller expressed concern about a future ballot measure for BPPD to increase the supplemental parcel tax and potential bankruptcy of the District. In addition, he raised the question about the level of service residents will receive between now and the election, and whether the tax increase will ensure that residents get the level of service they desire in the future.

Commissioner Muller also inquired whether Broadmoor residents would be on the hook for the new assessment, if approved, if the District still goes bankrupt. He expressed support for conducting an MSR and wanted it to be clear that the purpose would be to collect information and not to dissolve the District.

Chair Draper reopened the public comment period. John Aguerre, Broadmoor resident, stated that he would like the matrix to be updated and expressed appreciation for LAFCo's desire to provide information to the public. Mr. Aguerre stated that there is a lot of support in Broadmoor for the police district, and he would like to see a solution that would allow the District to remain.

<u>Commission Action:</u> The Commission directed staff to initiate a municipal service review of BPPD and to include the efforts staff has taken thus far to collect information from the District.

Commissioner Mueller suggested forming an ad-hoc committee to address the question of Broadmoor residents' ongoing financial obligation should the District fail at the current or proposed assessment level. Commissioners Mueller and Chang-Kiraly volunteered to be on the ad-hoc committee.

<u>Commission Action</u>: Commissioner Slocum moved to have Commissioners Chang-Kiraly and Mueller participate in an ad-hoc committee. Commissioner Rarback seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper, Mueller, Martin)

7. Appointment of Budget and Legislative/Policy Committees for 2024

Conversation ensued about the appointments to the budget and legislative and policy committees.

Chair Draper opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received.

<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Slocum moved to nominate Commissioner Chang-Kiraly, Draper and Bigstyck to the Budget Committee and Commissioners Martin, Mueller and Rarback to the Legislative/Policy Committee for 2024. Chair Draper seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper, Mueller, Martin)

8. Consider approval of the draft audit prepared by O'Connor & Company of the San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission's Financial Statements for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2022

Sofia Recalde, Management Analyst, presented the draft audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. No deficiencies in internal controls or instances of non-compliance were noted, and there were no issues with LAFCo financial statements.

Commissioner Bigstyck inquired about the loss in net position at the end of FY 2022. Staff responded that this was due to an issue of timing of when revenue from member agencies was

received and credited. In this case, revenue from member agencies that was meant for FY 22 was received and credited in FY 21. This issue has been addressed for FYs 23 and 24 with the revenue deferred to the correct year even if it is received in the prior fiscal year.

Commissioner Chang-Kiraly commented that best practice is to change firms every 5-6 years, Mr. Bartoli noted that this is the 3rd audit conducted by O'Connor and Company, staff intends to use O'Connor for the next audit, and that staff will look to a new vendor afterwards.

Chair Draper opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received.

<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Chang-Kiraly moved to approve the annual audit for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022. Commissioner Bigstyck seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper, Mueller, Martin)

9. Quarterly LAFCo Budget update - Information Only

Ms. Recalde presented the quarterly update for the LAFCo budget. LAFCo has received 100% of the 1/3 apportionment from member agencies and has received 99% of the total revenue budgeted for FY 23-24. Except for legal notices, expenditures are all within budget. Total year-to-date expenditures are 37% of budget. Staff anticipates that year-end expenditures will be lower than anticipated due to the ongoing Clerk vacancy.

Chair Draper opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received. Commission Action: None.

3. Chair and Vice Chair Appointment

Discussion ensued about the Chair and Vice Chair appointment.

Chair Draper opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received.

<u>Commission Action:</u> Commissioner Chang-Kiraly moved to approve appoint Commissioner Kati Martin as Chair and Commissioner Mueller as Vice Chair for 2024. Commissioner Rarback seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote. (Ayes: Commissioners Bigstyck, Chang-Kiraly, Rarback, Slocum, Draper, Mueller, Martin)

Outgoing Chair Draper transferred Chair duties to the newly appointed Chair Martin.

10. Legislative Report – Information Only

Ms. Recalde presented the legislative report. CALAFCO is currently tracking eleven bills, none of which are new in 2024 or have been significantly updated in 2024.

Chair Martin opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received. Commission Action: None.

11. CALAFCO 2023 Journal

The Commission received the CALAFCO Journal. Commissioner asked how conditions that are placed in MSRs are being enforced/implemented by other LAFCos. Mr. Bartoli stated that this may be an ongoing conversation of the CALAFCO Legislative Committee in the coming year and that he will provide updates as they occur.

Chair Martin opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received. Commission Action: None.

12. Item 12. Commissioner/Staff Reports – Information Only

Mr. Bartoli summarized an update received from Westborough Water District that highlighted their progress on several of the recommendations that LAFCo made in the MSR, including work related to updating the Districts Capital Improvement Plan, agenda packets being posted on the District website, and working on updating fiscal polies.

Mr. Bartoli also expressed thanks to outgoing Chair Draper for her leadership in 2023.

Chair Martin opened and closed public comment. No written or oral comments received.

Commission Action: None.

State of California

GOVERNMENT CODE

Section 56895

- 56895. (a) When a commission has adopted a resolution making determinations, any person or affected agency may file a written request with the executive officer requesting amendments to or reconsideration of the resolution. The request shall state the specific modification to the resolution being requested and shall state what new or different facts that could not have been presented previously are claimed to warrant the reconsideration. If the request is filed by a school district that received notification pursuant to Section 56658, the commission shall consider that request at a public hearing.
- (b) Notwithstanding Section 56106, the deadlines set by this section are mandatory. The person or agency shall file the written request within 30 days of the adoption of the initial or superseding resolution by the commission making determinations. If no person or agency files a timely request, the commission shall not take any action pursuant to this section.
- (c) Upon receipt of a timely request, the executive officer shall not take any further action until the commission acts on the request.
- (d) Upon receipt of a timely request by the executive officer, the time to file any action, including, but not limited to, an action pursuant to Section 21167 of the Public Resources Code and any provisions of Part 4 (commencing with Section 57000) governing the time within which the commission is to act shall be tolled for the time that the commission takes to act on the request.
- (e) The executive officer shall place the request on the agenda of the next meeting of the commission for which notice can be given pursuant to this subdivision. The executive officer shall give notice of the consideration of the request by the commission in the same manner as for the original proposal. The executive officer may give notice in any other manner as he or she deems necessary or desirable.
- (f) At that meeting, the commission shall consider the request and receive any oral or written testimony. The consideration may be continued from time to time but not to exceed 35 days from the date specified in the notice. The person or agency that filed the request may withdraw it at any time prior to the conclusion of the consideration by the commission.
- (g) At the conclusion of its consideration, the commission may approve with or without amendment, wholly, partially, or conditionally, or disapprove the request. If the commission disapproves the request, it shall not adopt a new resolution making determinations. If the commission approves the request, with or without amendment, wholly, partially, or conditionally, the commission shall adopt a resolution making determinations that shall supersede the resolution previously issued.

Summary

On November 15, 2023, the San Mateo LAFCo Commission approved LAFCo File 22-09 to establish the East Palo Alto Sanitary District (EPASD), an independent special district, as a subsidiary district of the City of East Palo Alto and related actions, including adopting a resolution approving the subsidiary district proposal with terms and conditions, adopting findings and determinations pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and declining to approve the alternative application submitted by EPASD. The Commission's approval is subject to protest proceedings pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000. A protest hearing and protest period will be set at a later date.

Government Code Section 56895 states when LAFCo adopts a resolution making determinations, any person or affected agency may file a written request with LAFCo requesting amendments to, or reconsideration of, the resolution. Government Code Section 56895 further provides that the request shall state the specific modification to the resolution being requested and shall state what new or different facts that could not have been presented previously are claimed to warrant the reconsideration.

On December 15, 2023 LAFCo received a letter via email dated December 15, 2023 from Iudis D. Sominskaia, Attorney with Burke, Williams & Sorensen, LLP. LAFCo received a hard copy of the letter via USPS. on December 22, 2023. Burke, Williams & Sorensen, LLP is currently serving

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as special legal counsel to EPASD. Ms. Sominskaia's letter (Attachment B) requests that in light of recent actions taken by the EPASD Board of Directors, the Commission should reverse the action taken on November 15, 2023 by 1) Denying the City's Proposal and 2) Approving the District's Alternative Proposal filed with San Mateo LAFCo on September 19, 2023, which proposed to (i) retain EPASD current governance structure, (ii) amend the District's Sphere of Influence to be coterminous with its service boundaries, and (iii) remove EPASD's territory from the Sphere of Influence of the West Bay Sanitary District.

Facts That the District Claim Warrant Reconsideration

The December 15, 2023 letter from Ms. Sominskaia proposes that four actions that EPASD has taken since the adoption of the LAFCo resolution on November 17, 2023 warrant the Commission's reconsideration:

1. On December 14, 2023, the District Board of Directors adopted a Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP") prepared by Sierra West, which defined the District's capital improvement objectives based on previous master plan studies and infrastructure repair requirements based on a recently completed closed-circuit television. The CIP is based on a thorough evaluation of expansion-related improvements needed to accommodate new development, and repair needs responsive to natural deterioration of the local pipeline. The CIP includes a priority list of repairs in the near and long term planning horizons, and a calculation of service rates needed to meet relevant cash flow projections.

LAFCo Response: The CIP document that was adopted by EPASD on December 14, 2023 was not included as part of the written request for reconsideration from EPASD. However, LAFCo staff reviewed the agenda packet for the December 14, 2023 EPASD Board Meeting, which included the proposed CIP (Attachment C). The CIP, prepared for EPASD by Sierra West Consultants Inc., consisted largely of data that had been collected by Sierra West Consultants for two CCTV survey reports, *CCTV Survey Results Evaluation and Pipeline Replacement Priorities Areas 1, 3, and 4* published on October 31, 2022 and *CCTV Survey Results Evaluation and Pipeline Replacement Priorities Area 2, Trunk Line, and All Areas* published on October 13, 2023. The two Sierra West Consultants reports were reviewed by the Commission at the November 15, 2023 meeting as part of the Alternative Application submitted by EPASD. The Capital Improvement Plan includes a five-year plan for proposed projects and estimated costs for improvements.

The CIP references a financial plan, the 2022 Sewer Rate Analysis, Working Draft Tables, produced by Bartle Wells Associates (no date) for the implementation of the proposed projects. This report was also reviewed by the Commission at the November 15, 2023 meeting as part of the Alternative Application submitted by EPASD. The Bartle Wells report proposes annual sewer rate increases for customers from 2023 to 2027, with an average increase of 6% a year. The proposed rates have not yet been adopted by EPASD. It also appears that the Bartle Wells report is incomplete, as it only references projects from the October 31, 2022 Sierra West Consultants report and not the October 13, 2023 Sierra West Consultants report.

The 2022 Sierra West Consultants report identified over \$20 million of high priority and near-term rehabilitation and replacement projects, with a total of \$53 million for future rehabilitation and replacement. As noted in the report, of the 117,589 linear feet

surveyed, 76,000 linear feet, or 65% of the lines inspected, are classified by the consultant as pipeline with substantial structural defects. Structural defects are described in the Sierra West memo as instances of broken or sagging pipes or areas where pipes are severely clogged.

No additional information about the status of this action has been provided to LAFCo.

2. On December 14, 2023, the District Board of Directors authorized the District General Manager to undertake a process to lower capacity fees from \$14,464 per equivalent dwelling unit to an amount between \$9,000 and \$10,000 per equivalent dwelling unit as determined by consultant based on adopted Capital Improvement Plan and authorized District General Manager to propose a process for refunding developers that previously paid higher fees.

LAFCo Response: In review of the EPASD agenda packet for the December 14, 2023 meeting, the staff report for this item only consisted of an agenda topic heading regarding direction to lower capacity fees and a recommendation to the EPASD Board to approve the item (Attachment C). Neither the staff report nor the meeting minutes (Attachment D) included any information about why the change in capacity fee was being requested, how EPASD determined that \$9,000 and \$10,000 per equivalent dwelling unit would be the appropriate fee, or how the reduction in capacity changes would impact the District's budget. In the Alternative Application submitted by EPASD, the District had stated that the \$14,464 capacity charge is, in their view, the most equitable charge for new development projects and is a fair and reasonable fee.

No additional information about the status of this action has been provided to LAFCo.

3. On December 14, 2023, District Board of Directors authorized District General Manager to undertake Article 13 Section 6 (Proposition 218) process to increase sewer rates commencing July 1, 2024 from \$600 per single family residence to the rate recommended by the District's consultant.

LAFCo Response: In review of the EPASD agenda packet for the December 14, 2023 meeting, the staff report for this item only consisted of an agenda topic heading regarding direction to initiate a process to increase sewer rates and a recommendation to the EPASD Board to approve the item (Attachment C). Neither the staff report not the meeting minutes (Attachment D) included information about why the change in sewer fee was being requested or the timeline for future action.

The 2022 Sewer Rate Analysis, Working Draft Tables, produced by Bartle Wells Associates (no date), included an analysis of the proposed sewer rates and was presented to the Commission as part of EPASD's Alternative Application at the November 17, 2023 LAFCo meeting.

No additional information about the status of this action has been provided to LAFCo.

4. On December 14, 2023, District Board of Directors authorized the District's special counsel to draft an Ordinance setting forth a process for negotiating and approving will serve letters and development agreements including consequences if the requirements of the ordinance are not met.

LAFCo Response: In review of the EPASD agenda packet for the December 14, 2023 meeting, the staff report for this item consisted only of an agenda topic heading regarding direction to initiate drafting an ordinance and a recommendation to the EPASD Board to approve the item (Attachment C). The EPASD December 14 meeting minutes noted that this item addresses an issue identified at the LAFCo hearing surrounding the uncertainty regarding the process by which the District negotiates will-service agreements and development agreements (Attachment D).

No additional information about the status of this action has been provided to LAFCo.

Options for Commission Action

After consideration of this report and any testimony or additional materials that are submitted during the public hearing, the Commission can take one of the following actions¹:

- Disapprove the request for reconsideration. If the Commission disapproves the request, it shall not adopt a new resolution making determinations. No further reconsideration of the November 17, 2023 decision would be authorized under Government Code Section 56895.
- Approve the request for reconsideration. The Commission may approve the request for reconsideration if the Commission believes that the request for reconsideration meets the statutory requirements and presents new or different facts that could not have been presented previously to the Commission.
- Upon approving the request for reconsideration, the Commission would then consider
 the merits of the reconsideration request. If the LAFCo Commission decides to approve
 the request for reconsideration and not order the establishment of EPASD as a
 subsidiary district of the City of East Palo Alto, the Commission would adopt a resolution
 making determinations that supersede the November 17, 2023 resolution.
 - If the Commission decides to approve the request for reconsideration and rescind its November 17, 2023 decision, the Commission will need to adopt a new resolution rescinding LAFCo Resolutions No. 1312 that approved the dissolution of the District and made certain findings and determinations, and adopt a resolution that would amend the District's Sphere of Influence to be coterminous with its service boundaries, and remove EPASD's territory from the Sphere of Influence of the West Bay Sanitary District.
- Continue this item to March 20, 2024, if the Commission needs more information.

Discussion and Staff's Recommendation

Based on the information submitted in the District's letter requesting reconsideration, LAFCo staff does not believe that the District had provided new or different facts that could not have been presented previously and that warrant reconsideration pursuant to Government Code Section 56895. The CIP document is largely comprised of data and documents that were presented to the LAFCo Commission at the November 17, 2023 meeting as part of EPASD's Alternative Application. LAFCo staff therefore recommends that the Commission disapprove the request for reconsideration.

The actions taken by EPASD's Board on December 14, 2023 seem to be in response to the November 17, 2023 LAFCo staff report, the City's Proposal, and to comments made by Commissioners regarding the Proposal and Alternative Application at the November 17 meeting. The letter from Ms. Sominskaia states that "the recent changes crystallize the District's position as the agent that can best provide sewer service to local ratepayers." As noted previously in this report, while these actions are in response to comments made by LAFCo Commissioners, there were other factors that led to the Commission's approval of the City's Proposal, including consistency with past LAFCo actions, a plan for service from the City, future growth, and State policy preference for provision of municipal services within city boundaries. Furthermore, three of the four actions taken by the EPASD Board on December 14, 2023 only authorized staff to begin work on increasing sewer rates, lowering connection fees and drafting an ordinance setting forth a process for negotiating and approving will serve letters and development agreements. The fourth action to adopt a CIP largely consisted of data that had previously been presented to LAFCo for consideration. Finally, staff does not believe that an agency's own actions subsequent to a LAFCo decision can constitute "new or different facts that could not have been presented previously" within the meaning of California Government Code Section 56895(a). Since the timing of the four District actions was entirely under the control of the District, there is no basis to conclude that the agency could not have presented these facts previously by taking its action prior to the Commission's consideration of the District's own Alternative Proposal in November 2023.

Other Comments in Reconsideration Request

Ms. Sominskaia's letter also included a comment about the transmittal of the adopted resolution for LAFCo File 22-09. While the signed copy of the resolution was sent to affected agencies on November 22, the resolution was adopted by the Commission on November 17, 2023. The transmittal of the resolution on a date after adoption does not change the adopted date of the resolution. In correspondence with LAFCo staff, EPASD has contented November 22 is that date of the adoption of the resolution, which would have made December 22, 2023 as the last date for LAFCo to receive the request for reconsideration. While the letter from Ms. Sominskaia is dated December 15, it was not emailed to LAFCo until December 17 and the hard copy of the letter was not received until December 22. Regardless of this issue, LAFCo staff has brought forward the request for reconsideration to the Commission.

Ms. Sominskaia's letter also includes a statement about the District's Alternative Application that was submitted to LAFCo and considered by the LAFCo Commission. LAFCo staff reviewed the SOI application against similar criteria required for the subsidiary district proposal and also presented the application to the LAFCo Commission for consideration at the same hearing as the subsidiary district proposal in alignment with Government Code Section. This included a review of documented submitted by EPASD including CCTV reports, draft financial documents, capacity and sewer rates, and District master plans.

As stated in the November 17, 2023 staff report, a special district that is the subject of a subsidiary district proposal has a right under the law to make an alternative proposal. In the context of the law governing LAFCo, a "proposal" is defined as a desired change of organization or reorganization initiated by a petition or by resolution of application of a legislative body or

school district for which a certificate of filing has been issued². A "change of organization" is a defined term under the law and includes a list of LAFCo actions relating to governance changes³. A mere request for a SOI amendment is considered an "application" and does not amount to a change of organization or reorganization.

LAFCo Determinations for City Proposal

The City's Proposal that was approved by the LAFCo Commission on November 17, 2023 included application materials, a plan for service, a capital improvement plan, and a proposed budget for EPASD operations and maintenance and capital improvement. The City's application to LAFCo contained a technical memorandum prepared by Freyer & Laureta (F&L), a consulting firm, that outlines its plan for capital improvements to address capacity and development issues and proposes a budget for both capital improvements and ongoing operations and maintenance if EPASD were to become a subsidiary district of the City. The LAFCo Commission determined that the City's proposed budget and improvement plan would best serve the needs of the community while protecting the health and safety of residents and ratepayers.

As stated in the November 17, 2023 LAFCo staff report and the adopted resolution, the City's proposal to establish EPASD as a subsidiary district aligns with the State's policy preference of a single multi-purpose government agency for urbanized areas (i.e., the City of East Palo Alto) to provide municipal services (Government Code Section 56001). While the subsidiary district would maintain EPASD as a separate entity from the City, the subsidiary district model adheres to the intent of the State Legislature. Furthermore, the establishment of EPASD as a subsidiary district of the City of East Palo Alto aligns with the preferred governance options outlined in the adopted 2009 and 2022 MSRs.

The LAFCo Commission approved the proposal that EPASD become a subsidiary district of the City of East Palo, with its City Council acting as the EPASD Board, for several reasons:

- Planning for wastewater utilities could align with the City's envisioned land use planning and established master plans.
- The City could address and balance infrastructure requirements, funding options, and developer requirements, to facilitate needed new housing, jobs and municipal revenues to improve public services.
- The management of wastewater service delivery to the residents of the District would likely be enhanced with the substantive management and organizational structure of the City in which the contracted sewer service provider would be managed by the City Manager and City Public Works Director who would report to the City Council which, as the ex officio Board of Directors for EPASD, are beholden to EPASD rate payers.
- Enhanced efficiencies by removing a layer of government and enhanced ease of use of constituents, with single provider of services.

Finally, as described in the 2022 Municipal Service Review for the City of East Palo Alto, EPASD, and the West Bay Sanitary District and stated in the City's Proposal, the City has more resources

that it can leverage to bring state and federal funding to sewer service-related projects and can do so more efficiently without coordinating among multiple agencies and boards.

Notice

Public notice of the hearing was mailed and emailed to affected agencies and interested parties at least 21 days prior to the February 7, 2024 LAFCo hearing. As allowed for in Government Code, a public notice was published at least 21 days prior to the hearing as a 1/8th page display advertisement in the San Mateo County Times, The Almanac, and The Daily Post because the total number of notices required to be mailed exceeded 1,000. There are roughly 4,000 parcels and approximately 9,600 registered voters in the affected territory. This noticing is in the same manner as the original proposal⁴.

Protest Proceedings

If LAFCo disapproves the request for reconsideration, protest proceedings will follow LAFCo staff will give notice of the protest hearing to all landowners and registered voters in the affected territory (i.e. the service area of the East Palo Alto Sanitary District) via 1/8th page display ads in at minimum the San Mateo County Times published in both English and Spanish. Direct mailing of notices is not required because the mailing lists exceed 1,000.

- Landowner Protest: If protests are filed by fewer than 25% of the number of landowners owning less than 25% of the assessed value of land, the Commission shall order the formation of the subsidiary district. If 25% to 50% of the landowners file protests, the Commission shall order the organization be subject to an election. Over 50% landowner protest terminates the proposal.
- Registered Voter Protest: If protests are filed by fewer than 25% of the number of registered voters in the affected territory, the Commission shall order the formation of the subsidiary district. If 25% to 50% of the registered voters file protests, the Commission shall order the organization be subject to an election. Over 50% registeredvoter protest terminates the proposal.

LAFCo staff had set a protest hearing for February 16, 2024 prior to the submittal of the request for reconsideration from EPASD. Upon receiving the reconsideration request, LAFCo staff sent notice cancelling this hearing. It is anticipated that a new notice setting the protest period and protest hearing date will be published the week of February 12, 2024.

On November 15, 2023, San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission ("SMLAFCo") duly adopted Resolution No. 1312¹, approving File No. 22-09, the City of East Palo Alto's ("City") proposal to establish the East Palo Alto Sanitary District ("District") as a subsidiary district of the City ("City's Proposal").

Since SMLAFCo Resolution No. 1312 was adopted, the District has undertaken the following additional efforts:

1. On December 14, 2023, the District Board of Directors adopted a Capital Improvement Plan ("CIP") prepared by Sierra West, which defined the District's capital improvement objectives based on previous master plan studies and infrastructure repair requirements based on a recently completed closed-circuit television. The CIP is based on a thorough evaluation of expansion-related improvements needed to accommodate new development, and repair needs responsive to natural deterioration of the local pipeline. The CIP includes a priority list of repairs in the near and long term planning horizons, and a calculation of service rates needed to meet relevant cash flow projections.

The recent changes crystallize the District's position as the "agency that can best provide" sewer service to local ratepayers under Gov. Code section 56001. In light of these new and/or different facts, and pursuant to Gov. Code section 56895, the East Palo Alto Sanitary District ("District" or "EPASD") formally requests reconsideration of Resolution No. 1312, and asks that SMLAFCo proceed as follows:

- 1. Deny the City's Proposal.
- 2. Approve the District's Alternative Proposal², filed with SMLAFCo on September 19, 2023, which proposed to (i) retain EPASD current governance structure.

² Staff Report issued by SMLAFCo in connection with the November 15, 2023 hearing, stated that the Alternative Proposal did not "properly track the requirements of a 'proposal'." But the Government Code does not support this conclusion: the Code refers only to Section 56861 when defining an alternative proposal. (Gov. Code § 56862(d).) Section 56861, in turn, refers to "an alternative proposal to the subsidiary district proposal," describing the procedural requirements of filing a Resolution of Intent, and **providing no other limitations**. The description of "proposal" contained in the Staff Report is from definitions found in Section 56069, and makes no reference to what an alternative to said "proposal" would actually constitute (and whether it would be limited to an enumerated list of subtypes of changes in organization). The District fully complied with Section 56861 by issuing a Resolution of Intent to File an Alternative Proposal and



1.0 Introduction

The East Palo Alto Sanitary District (EPASD) provides wastewater collection facilities and services to most of East Palo Alto and a portion of Menlo Park. The service area is primarily residential with a central commercial area, local restaurants, and a few light industrial parcels. The area covers over 1.9 square miles and includes more than 160,000 linear feet of gravity sewer pipelines, including a parallel siphon pipeline beneath San Francisquito Creek and a trunk line to the Palo Alto Regional Water Quality Control Plant (Figure 1). Approximately 70% of the pipelines are 6-inch diameter with collector pipelines between 8- and 24-inch diameter and the trunk sewer has 24- and 30-inch diameter pipelines. Many of the pipelines are aging beyond their useful life.

Capital improvement needs include expanding capacity to accommodate new developments and repairing deteriorating pipelines. This Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) evaluates capacity needs based on previous master plan studies and infrastructure repair requirements based on a recently completed closed-circuit television (CCTV) inspection of the collection system pipelines. From these evaluations, the CIP develops a priority list of pipelines to repair or replace in the near- and long-term planning horizons.

2.0 Background

The current and projected land use is in accordance with the City of East Palo Alto General Plan. Recent developments have increased land use residential densities from low to medium and high to accommodate new apartments, condominium, and mixed-use projects. These types of developments result in increased wastewater flow rates that have been evaluated in the East Palo Alto Sanitary District Master Plan Update (March 2015, Freyer & Laureta, Inc.) and the Addendum to the March 2015 East Palo alto Sanitary District Master Plan Update (April 28, 2021, Freyer & Laureta, Inc.)

In addition to revised land uses, the master plans incorporated an inflow and infiltration (I&I) study provided by V&A Consulting Engineers in June 2012. I&I accounts for increased wastewater flow rates during storm events where rainwater enters the collection system through broken pipelines and manholes. High groundwater areas are also susceptible to I&I whenever the groundwater level is above the pipeline elevation. Improvements to the collection system since 2012 should reduce I&I, while continued deterioration of aging pipelines will increase I&I.

The master plans identified pipelines that were undersized for expected development plans. Final recommendations from the 2021 Addendum were summarized in Table 16 and Figure 10, included herein as Appendix A. These results were used to evaluate pipeline upgrade priorities.

3.0 CCTV Investigations, Capacity Evaluations, and Priority Assessment

CCTV investigations were conducted to clean, inspect and assess sewer pipelines throughout the service area. The service area was divided into four areas for organizational and contracting purposes (Figure 1). Over 700 pipelines were inspected by National Plant Services, Inc. (NPS), and a video recording with a summary report was made for each pipeline.

The CCTV results were used to develop a priority list of pipelines to be replaced. The evaluation considers the degree of structural deficiencies based on the CCTV results. Pipeline capacity upgrades are based on the master plan recommends (Appendix A). The priority assessment considers the most necessary improvements to be addressed under a limited budget.

3.1 Evaluation of CCTV Survey Results and Structural Scores

The following CCTV surveys were completed for the area shown on Figure 1:

Details of the surveys in each area are provided in Appendix B. NPS evaluated each pipeline with respect to its structural integrity and operations and maintenance (O&M) functionality. These evaluations were made in accordance with the National Association of Sewer Service Companies (NASSCO) and their Pipeline Assessment and Certification Program (PACP). NPS used PACP's Quick Rating approach by assigning a 4-digit code for a Structural grade and an O&M grade.

Each digit of the code represents the following:

- The first digit is recorded as 0 through 5 to represent the degree of severity of the encountered problem. 0 is no problem and 5 is the most severe.
- The second digit is how many times a problem of this severity was encountered in the pipeline segment. This ranges from 1 to 9, and then letters are used when there are more than nine problem locations. A represents 10 to 14 defects; B is 15 to 19; C is 20 to 24, etc.
- The third digit represents the second worst level of severity encountered.
- The fourth digit represents how many times the second severity of problem occurred.

Each of the four-digit codes is used to calculate a single score by multiplying the degree of severity by the number of occurrences, and then adding the two products. For instance, a Structural rating of 5432 would equal 26 (5*4 + 3*2).

The Structural rating addresses items that require pipeline repair to resolve, such as a cracked or broken pipe. The O&M rating addresses items that can be resolved by improved maintenance, such as a rootball or debris.

The Structural rating (or score) is augmented by including Notable Defects and Sagging scores. The CCTV generated scores were found to overestimate the actual damage based on reviewing a cross section of videos where limited structural defects were observed. As such, the Structural Score was augmented based on field

notes taken while the CCTV surveys were in progress. Notable Defects, and Sagging scores were developed from the field notes.

In general, structural conditions are acceptable in the larger and newer pipelines constructed of polyvinyl chloride (PVC) materials on the eastern side of the system near the trunk line. Moving westward, such as subbasin B in Area 2, the older pipelines tend to be constructed of vitrified clay materials and have greater structural damage. The trunk link is in good structural condition and does not require any repairs.

3.2 Capacity Evaluation

Table 16 and Figure 10 from the 2021 Addendum (Appendix A) summarize the pipeline segments that are undersized and identified for upgrading. At the same time, these pipelines may, or may not, be identified in the CCTV surveys for structural repairs or replacement. The timing for capacity upgrades is largely based on growth and development schedules, and funding availability.

Primary collector pipelines in Beech Street and O'Connor Street were identified as uniquely significant because these pipelines receive wastewater from larger tributary areas. As such, their capacity affects land use in substantial portions of town. For instance, the Beech Street pipelines receive wastewater from subbasins (moving upstream) I, H, E, and D. Similarly, O'Connor Street pipelines receive wastewater from subbasins K, M, N, L, and O. As such, capacity expansion projects for these collector lines are underway.

A scoring system was developed to account for capacity upgrades. The size of the pipeline diameter in inches was multiplied by a normalization factor to provide a relevant weight of the capacity score with the structural scores. This allows comparison and summation of the capacity and structural scores.

The trunk pipeline is adequately sized for current conditions but will need to be expanded to accommodate future development, as shown on Figure 10 from the *Master Plan Update*. A parallel trunk sewer pipeline expansion project is under design that will double the capacity of the pipeline downstream from the siphon at manhole T32 to the wastewater treatment plant at T0. It may be necessary to upgrade other trunk pipelines in the future.

3.3 Priority Assessment

This evaluation considers the hydraulic capacity along with the structural integrity to develop a priority list for the entire wastewater collection system. The Light Tree and Beech Street pipeline replacement projects are incorporated into the spreadsheets as completed projects without any current repair or replacement needs.

The Light Tree project included approximately \$2M of pipeline upgrades during 2023 at the east end of O'Connor Street and upstream into Pulgas Avenue. Similarly, the Beech Street project included approximately \$5M of pipeline upgrades during 2023/2024 at the east end of Beech Street and upstream into Clarke Avenue and Green Street.

The scoring evaluation summarized in Table 1 for the entire system develops a priority of pipeline segments that need to be replaced. Recent activities with the Light Tree and Beech Street projects addressed a significant portion of under capacity pipelines. As such, structural scoring is more predominant in the current listing, although there are remaining capacity concerns.

The Structural, Notable Defects, Sagging, and the Capacity scores, are added to create the Total Score for each pipeline segment. The Total Scores are ranked from highest to lowest to generate a priority list of pipelines to replace. Pipelines with a Total Score greater than 105 were selected as pipelines for replacement in the near future (**Table 2**). This priority list is also anticipated to have a construction budget approximately \$10M. **Figure 2** shows the pipelines with priority for replacement (scores > 105) considering all Areas and the trunk line.

The priority list was sorted by pipeline diameter in **Table 3** to evaluate probable costs. The Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost for this hypothetical project (**Table 4**) was prepared using bid results from recent EPASD projects as a basis for unit price estimates. Published industry cost data and engineering judgement were also used where recent bid prices were incomplete.

As shown, approximately 13,500 linear feet of pipeline throughout the collection system have a total score greater than 105. The opinion of probable construction cost is approximately \$11M, while the opinion of total project budget is \$12M.

Further evaluations were conducted to develop opinions of probable costs for future phases of work. Scoring delineation intervals were selected to approximately annual phases of work of approximately \$10M over the next four years, followed by the remaining pipeline segments to a low score of 50, as shown in the summary table below.

4.0 Proposed Projects and Opinion of Probable Costs

The highest priority pipelines for replacement, with scores greater than 105, are shown in Figure 2. The opinion of project cost for these pipelines is \$12.5M and includes two crossings of the Bayshore Freeway and three trunk line replacements. To manage the projects efficiently, approximately \$6M of pipeline replacements are highlighted in Figure 3 as the first phase. While this phase is under construction, a second phase can be designed and permitted with CalTrans to address the freeway crossings. It is also recommended to delay the upper trunk line segments because these are in good structural condition.

The lower trunk line expansion project is also under design. It is anticipated that the design will be completed during early 2024 and construction may begin later in the year.

It is also recommended to upgrade the Master Plan to include the results of recent improvements, an updated I&I evaluation, and updated hydraulic modeling. It is anticipated that the Master Plan update would occur following the second phase of high priority pipeline replacements.

The following sequencing of projects and opinion of costs (in millions) are anticipated:

6.0 Limitations

The CIP evaluations and analyses are based on data collected by others, engineering judgements, and projections into the future. As such, the results and conclusions should be viewed with a regard to their uncertainty and use in a planning-level study. Sierra West Consultants does not guarantee or provide any warranty for the existing sanitary sewer pipeline conditions, their flow capacities, or the future flow rates that may pass through these pipelines.

It is recommended, and expected, that pipeline evaluations become more detailed as projects transition from planning-level priority recommendations to design-level construction details. As high priority projects are identified, the design-level evaluation is anticipated to include a thorough review of the CCTV videos, future flow rate projections, and a detailed assessment of specific repair or replacement requirements.

Motion: Director Yañez moved, seconded by Director Bello for approval to authorize the General Manager to undertake a process to lower capacity fees from \$14,464 per equivalent dwelling unit to an amount between \$9,000 and \$10,000 per equivalent dwelling unit determined by consultant based on approved Capital Improvement Plan and authorize General Manager to propose a process for refunding developers that previously paid higher fees. Motion passed with one abstention by Director Savage.

Municipal Service Review Workplan Discussion Subject:

Background and Summary

Government Code Section 56430 of the Cortese Knox Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (Act) requires LAFCO to conduct municipal service reviews (MSRs) prior to establishing or updating spheres of influence (SOI). MSRs are intended to serve as a tool to help LAFCO, the public and other agencies better understand public service governance and delivery, and to evaluate options for the provision of efficient and effective public services. MSRs are intended to support SOIs, which are often prepared together in the same report; however, MSRs may also be conducted independent of the SOI process.

Section 56425(g) also states that LAFCos shall, as necessary, review and update each sphere of influence every five years.

By the end of Fiscal Year 2024, it is anticipated that San Mateo LAFCo will have completed at least one MSR/SOI for every city and special district in the County. Looking ahead, staff is proposing to create and adopt an MSR schedule to ensure that San Mateo LAFCo can assess the availability and adequacy of services delivered by cities and special districts throughout the County in an organized manner.

Traditionally, San Mateo LAFCo adopts a workplan as part of its annual budget. This work plan includes the list of MSRs that are proposed to be completed during that fiscal year. Ahead of the draft budget and workplan for FY24-25, LAFCo staff is seeking feedback from the Commission regarding a muti-year MSR workplan. A muti-year plan would allow LAFCo staff and the Commission the opportunity to improve the planning and resource allocation for MSRs and would allow for subject agencies and the public to have a better sense of timing for when a report would be prepared. The workplan could also be amended by Commission in response to changing priorities or resources.

Staff researched 10 LAFCos to understand how other LAFCos plan for their service reviews (Attachment A). Some do not appear to have a methodology for how and when they conduct MSRs; however, several do. Santa Clara, Alameda and Contra Costa have developed a schedule

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that primarily conducts MSRs based on city and service type. Orange and San Diego have developed a more regional focused MSR schedule.

Staff has prepared several MSR schedule options for the Commission's consideration (Attachment B). The options include a regional (e.g., North County, Coast) vs. service/agency type (e.g., water providers, cities, fire districts) and staff vs consultant lead MSRs. The draft schedule is for illustrative purposes only and the order of future MSRs will need to be approved by the Commission.

Previous MSRs have varied in type as one type of MSR may not fit for all agencies. Also, some agencies that are subject to MSRs have had several completed since LAFCo first conducted MSRs in 2003 (Attachment C). For instance, the Broadmoor Police Protection District has had three MSRs completed, and several other agencies have had two MSRs completed. In other cases, agencies have only had one MSR during this time period with some MSRs completed over 15 years ago. A muti-year workplan is anticipated to help staff and the Commission make decisions about how to move forward with future MSRs and allocate resources to complete these reports.

Recommended Commission Action:

- 1) Provide direction to staff regarding the options discussed above, and
- 2) Direct staff to schedule a meeting with the Budget Committee to further develop a MSR workplan and to bring back the item to the Commission in March for review as part of the draft FY24-25 Budget and Workplan.

We will audit the financial statements of the governmental-type activities and the major fund, including the disclosures, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements of San Mateo Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) as of and for the year ended June 30, 2023. Accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) provide for certain required supplementary information (RSI), such as management's discussion and analysis (MD&A), to supplement San Mateo LAFCo's basic financial statements. Such information, although not a part of the basic financial statements, is required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board who considers it to be an essential part of financial reporting for placing the basic financial statements in an appropriate operational, economic, or historical context. As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to San Mateo LAFCo's RSI in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). These limited procedures will consist of inquiries of management regarding the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient appropriate evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. The following RSI is required by GAAP and will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited:

- 1. Management's Discussion and Analysis.
- 2. Statements of Revenues, Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balance Budget and Actual General Fund.

The objectives of our audit are to obtain reasonable assurance as to whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion about whether your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with GAAP; and report on the fairness of the supplementary information referred to in the second paragraph when considered in relation to the financial statements as a whole. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements, including omissions, can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment of a reasonable user made based on the financial statements.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

We will conduct our audit in accordance with GAAS and will include tests of your accounting records and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such opinions. As part of an audit in accordance with GAAS, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We will evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management.

We will also evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements, including the disclosures, and determine whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the government or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the government.

Because of the inherent limitations of an audit, combined with the inherent limitations of internal control, and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is an unavoidable risk that some material misstatements may not be detected by us, even though the audit is properly planned and performed in accordance with GAAS. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. However, we will inform the appropriate level of management of any material errors, fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets that comes to our attention. We will also inform the appropriate level of management of any violations of laws or governmental regulations that come to our attention, unless clearly inconsequential. Our responsibility as auditors is limited to the period covered by our audit and does not extend to any later periods for which we are not engaged as auditors.

We will also conclude, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the government's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts, tests of the physical existence of inventories, and direct confirmation of receivables and certain assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected customers, creditors, and financial institutions. We will also request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement.

We may, from time to time and depending on the circumstances, use third-party service providers in serving your account. We may share confidential information about you with these service providers but remain committed to maintaining the confidentiality and security of your information. Accordingly, we maintain internal policies, procedures, and safeguards to protect the confidentiality of your personal information. In addition, we will secure confidentiality agreements with all service providers to maintain the confidentiality of your information and we will take reasonable precautions to determine that they have appropriate procedures in place to prevent the unauthorized release of your confidential information to others. In the event that we are unable to secure an appropriate confidentiality agreement, you will be asked to provide your consent prior to the sharing of your confidential information with the third-party service provider. Furthermore, we will remain responsible for the work provided by any such third-party service providers.

Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you of your responsibilities.

Audit Procedures—Internal Control

We will obtain an understanding of the government and its environment, including internal control relevant to the audit, sufficient to identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to error or fraud, and to design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks and obtain evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinions. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentation, or the override of internal control. An audit is not designed to provide assurance on internal control or to identify deficiencies in internal control. Accordingly, we will express no such opinion. However, during the audit, we will communicate to management and those charged with governance internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under AICPA professional standards.

Audit Procedures—Compliance

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, we will perform tests of San Mateo LAFCo's compliance with the provisions of applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and agreements. However, the objective of our audit will not be to provide an opinion on overall compliance and we will not express such an opinion.

Other Services

We will also assist in preparing the financial statements of San Mateo LAFCo in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America based on information provided by you. We will perform the services in accordance with applicable professional standards. The other services are limited to the financial statement services previously defined. We, in our sole professional judgment, reserve the right to refuse to perform any procedure or take any action that could be construed as assuming management responsibilities.

You agree to assume all management responsibilities for the financial statement preparation services and any other nonattest services we provide; oversee the services by designating an individual, preferably from senior management, with suitable skill, knowledge, or experience; evaluate the adequacy and results of the services; and accept responsibility for them.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Our audit will be conducted on the basis that you acknowledge and understand your responsibility for designing, implementing, and maintaining internal controls relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, including monitoring ongoing activities; for the selection and application of accounting principles; and for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America with the oversight of those charged with governance.

Management is responsible for making drafts of financial statements, all financial records, and related information available to us and for the accuracy and completeness of that information (including information from outside of the general and subsidiary ledgers). Your responsibilities include acknowledging to us in the representation letter that (1) you are responsible for presentation of the supplementary information in accordance with GAAP; (2) you believe the supplementary information, including its form and content, is fairly presented in accordance with GAAP; (3) the methods of measurement or presentation have not changed from those used in the prior period (or, if they have changed, the reasons for such changes); and (4) you have disclosed to us any significant assumptions or interpretations underlying the measurement or presentation of the supplementary information.

Engagement Administration, Fees, and Other

We understand that your employees will prepare all cash, accounts receivable, and other confirmations we request and will locate any documents selected by us for testing. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete the audit or are unable to form or have not formed opinions, we may decline to express opinions or withdraw from this engagement.

We reserve the right to suspend or terminate our work if you have failed to fulfill your responsibilities set forth in this engagement letter, and such failure materially interferes with our work. As of January 30, 2024, CALAFCO is tracking 12 bills. Legislation that is of interest to San Mateo LAFCo includes:

• AB 805 would authorize the state board, if sufficient funds are available, to order consolidation of sewer service with consolidation of drinking water systems when both of the receiving and subsumed water systems provide sewer service and after the state board engages in certain activities, including, but not limited to, consulting with the relevant regional water board and the receiving water system and conducting outreach to ratepayers and residents served by the receiving and subsumed water systems, as provided. The bill would also authorize the state board to require the administrator to provide administrative, technical, legal, or managerial services for any sewer service provided by the designated water system. (CALAFCO – Watch with Concerns)

AB 68 (Ward D) Land use: streamlined housing approvals: density, subdivision, and utility approvals.

Summary:

Would require a local government to approve a proposed housing development pursuant to a streamlined, ministerial approval process if the development meets certain objective planning standards, including, but not limited to, a requirement that the proposed parcel for the development be a climate-smart parcel, as described, or be included in the applicable region's sustainable communities strategy as a priority development area. The bill would set forth procedures for approving these developments and would set forth various limitations for these developments. The bill would authorize the Department of Housing and Community Development to review, adopt, amend, and repeal guidelines, rules, and regulations to implement uniform standards or criteria that supplement or clarify the terms, references, or standards set forth by this process.

Position: Watch **Subject:** Planning

CALAFCO Comments: This bill was introduced as a spot holder in December, 2022, then was gutted and amended on March 16, 2023.

It now seeks to set up ministerial approvals for developments and certain water and sewer service extensions for developments that meet certain parameters. Parameters include that the parcel must be in a high or moderate resource area as categorized by the opportunity maps maintained by the California Tax Credit Allocation Committee, be located within one-mile of transit but be in a very low vehicle travel area, and within one mile of assorted restaurants, bars, coffee shops, etc. Additionally, types of locations that do not qualify are also enumerated. Those include farmlands, wetlands, high fire hazard severity zones (as determined by Cal Fire), in proximity to a hazardous waste site, within a delineated earthquake fault zone, within a special flood hazard area or within a regulatory floodway, lands identified for conservation, protected habitat, and lands under a conservation easement.

3/31/2023: Watch position taken by Leg Committee.

4/21/2023: CALAFCO received word from the Assembly Housing and Community Development Committee, that this bill will not be heard this year.

Under the procedure that would be established by this bill, a minimum of 30 days notice to LAFCo would be required for the public hearing should a county seek to amend its general plan to increase the planned density on climate resilient lands.

Summary:

Would prohibit a person under 12 years of age from operating an electric bicycle of any class. The bill would state the intent of the Legislature to create an e-bike license program with an online written test and a state-issued photo identification for those persons without a valid driver's license, prohibit persons under 12 years of age from riding e-bikes, and create a stakeholders working group composed of the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Department of the California Highway Patrol, the Transportation Agency, bicycle groups, policy and fiscal staff, and other relevant stakeholders to work on recommendations to establish an e-bike training program and license. Because the bill would prohibit certain persons from riding electric bicycles, the violation of which would be a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

CALAFCO Comments: As introduced, this bill was relative to greenhouse emissions. However, it was gutted and amended on 5/15/2023 and now addresses county water authorities.

Under existing law, the governing body of any public agency has an option (phrased as a "may") to submit to the voters any proposition to exclude the corporate area of that public agency from a county water authority. This bill would add the procedures under which that optional election would be conducted. Specifically, notice would be required in the manner already defined within subdivision (c) of Section 10. The election would be conducted and returns canvased as provided by law for the elections in the public agency, and a majority of electors within county water authority territory would be needed for passage. The new procedure would also require that these elections will be separate elections but may run with another election.

On 6/16/2023, this topic was transitioned to AB 399 through the gut and amend process. Amendments of 7/13/2023 make this bill now relative to electric bicycles which is not a concern to CALAFCO. Position updated to -None-.

AB 805 (Arambula D) Sewer service: disadvantaged communities.

Summary:

Under current law, the State Water Resources Control Board and the 9 California regional water quality control boards regulate water quality in accordance with the Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act and the federal Clean Water Act. Current law authorizes a regional board to order the provision of sewer service by a receiving sewer system, as defined, to a disadvantaged community served by an inadequate onsite sewage treatment system, as defined. This bill would authorize the state board to require a sewer service provider to contract with an administrator designated or approved by the state board for administrative, technical, operational, legal, or managerial services to assist a designated sewer system with the provision of adequate sewer service, as defined. The bill would also authorize the state board to order a designated sewer system to accept those services, including full management and control of all aspects of the designated sewer system, from an administrator. The bill would define "designated sewer system" for these purposes as a sewer system that serves a disadvantaged community and that the state board finds to be either an inadequate sewage treatment system or a sewer system that has demonstrated difficulty in maintaining technical, managerial, and financial capacity to prevent fraud and mismanagement, or a sewer system that voluntarily accepts financial assistance for the provision of adequate sewer service.

Position: Watch With Concerns

Subject: Water

CALAFCO Comments: This bill would authorize the state board, if sufficient funds are available, to order consolidation of sewer service along with an order of consolidation of drinking water systems when both of the receiving and subsumed water systems provide sewer service and after the state board engages in certain activities. Under existing section (b)(3) LAFCos must be consulted and their input considered in regards to the provision of water service but sewer systems seem to be lacking.

Summary:

The Ralph M. Brown Act requires, with specified exceptions, each legislative body of a local agency to provide notice of the time and place for its regular meetings and an agenda containing a brief general description of each item of business to be transacted. The act also requires that all meetings of a legislative body be open and public, and that all persons be permitted to attend unless a closed session is authorized. The act generally requires for teleconferencing that the legislative body of a local agency that elects to use teleconferencing post agendas at all teleconference locations, identify each teleconference location in the notice and agenda of the meeting or proceeding, and have each teleconference location be accessible to the public. Existing law also requires that, during the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction. Current law authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use alternate teleconferencing provisions during a proclaimed state of emergency (emergency provisions) and, until January 1, 2026, in certain circumstances related to the particular member if at least a quorum of its members participate from a singular physical location that is open to the public and situated within the agency's jurisdiction and other requirements are met (nonemergency provisions). This bill, until January 1, 2026, would authorize a subsidiary body, as defined, to use similar alternative teleconferencing provisions and would impose requirements for notice, agenda, and public participation, as prescribed. In order to use teleconferencing pursuant to this act, the bill would require the legislative body that established the subsidiary body by charter, ordinance, resolution, or other formal action to make specified findings by majority vote, before the subsidiary body uses teleconferencing for the first time and every 12 months thereafter.

Position: Watch Subject: Brown Act

CALAFCO Comments: This bill appears to be a spot holder in that it currently only makes minor grammatical changes. The lack of substance raises concern regarding future changes to this bill.

3/16/2023: The bill was amended to speak specifically to teleconferenced meetings of subsidiary bodies, defined as a body that serves exclusively in an advisory capacity, and is not authorized to take final action on legislation, regulations, contracts, licenses, permits, or any other entitlements. For qualifying bodies, this bill would remove the requirement to post an agenda at the location of the subsidiary body member who was participating from off site- providing that the legislative body that formed the subsidiary body has previously made findings noting that teleconferenced meetings of the subsidiary body would enhance public access, and would promote the attractions, retention and diversity of the subsidiary body. The superior legislative body would need to revisit the matter and repeat those finding every 12 months thereafter. This bill also reaffirms that other provisions of the Brown Act are applicable to subsidiary bodies.

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Summary:

The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act requires all groundwater basins designated as high-

Current law defines various terms for purposes of the act. This bill would add various defined terms for purposes of the act, including the terms "managed wetland" and "small community water system."

CALAFCO Comments: Adds definitions for Managed Wetlands, and Small community water

system to Water Code Section 10721.

4/17/2023: Amended to define agencies and entities required or excluded from existing 10726.4 (a)(4). Amends Water Code section 10730.2 to add language regarding fees, and amends Water Code section 10733 to address groundwater sustainability plans.

Failed to make April policy committee deadline and now cannot be acted upon until January 2024.

AB 930 (Friedman D) Local government: Reinvestment in Infrastructure for a Sustainable and Equitable California (RISE) districts.

Summary:

Would authorize the legislative bodies of 2 or more cities or counties to jointly form a Reinvestment in Infrastructure for a Sustainable and Equitable California district (RISE district) in accordance with specified procedures. The bill would authorize a special district to join a RISE district, by resolution, as specified. The bill would require the Office of Planning and Research (OPR) to develop guidelines for the formation of RISE districts no later than November 30, 2026. The bill would provide for the establishment of a governing board of a RISE district with representatives of each participating local government.

Position: Neutral

Subject: Special District Principle Acts

CALAFCO Comments: This bill has a similar overtone to SB 852 Dodd in 2022 regarding the formation of climate resilience districts outside of the LAFCo process.

As introduced, this bill (AB 930) is focused on the generation of funding and the governance of the expenditure of those funds. However, it should be carefully tracked in case that mission is expanded.

Failed to meet deadlines and now a 2 year bill that cannot be acted upon until January, 2024.

AB 1379 (Papan D) Open meetings: local agencies: teleconferences.

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Summary:

The Ralph M. Brown Act, requires, with specified exceptions, that all meetings of a legislative body be open and public, and that all persons be permitted to attend unless a closed session is authorized. The act generally requires for teleconferencing that the legislative body of a local agency that elects to use teleconferencing post agendas at all teleconference locations, identify each teleconference location in the notice and agenda of the meeting or proceeding, and have each teleconference location be accessible to the public. Current law also requires that, during the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction. This bill, with respect to those general provisions on telegonferencing, would require a legislative body

electing to use teleconferencing to instead post agendas at a singular designated physical meeting location, as defined, rather than at all teleconference locations. The bill would remove the requirements for the legislative body of the local agency to identify each teleconference location in the notice and agenda, that each teleconference location be accessible to the public, and that at least a quorum of the members participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction.

Position: Watch Subject: Brown Act

CALAFCO Comments: Originally introduced as a spotholder to address "Local agencies: financial affairs", this bill was gutted and amended on March 23, 2023, and now seeks amendment of the Brown Act's teleconferencing provisions. If successful, GC Section 54953 (b)(3) would be amended to remove the requirement to post agendas for teleconferenced meetings at all locations, and would instead limit the posting to a newly defined "singular designated physical meeting location", which is required to have either two-way audiovisual capabilities, or two-way telephone service for the public to remotely hear and address the body. Additionally, the body would have to hold at least two meetings in person each year.

Failed to meet deadlines and now a 2 year bill that cannot be acted upon until January, 2024.

AB 1460 (Bennett D) Local government.

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Summary:

Existing law, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, provides the exclusive authority and procedure for the initiation, conduct, and completion of changes of organization and reorganization for cities and districts, except as specified. This bill would make a nonsubstantive change to the provision naming the act.

Position: Neutral

Subject: CKH General Procedures, Other

CALAFCO Comments: As introduced, this bill makes only a minor nonsubstantive change to CKH in that it would merely add commas to Section 56000 so that it would read: "This division shall be known, and may be cited, as the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000."

3/24/2023: No change since introduction.

Failed to meet deadlines and now a 2 year bill that cannot be acted upon until January, 2024.

AB 1928 (Sanchez R) Worker classification: employees and independent contractors.

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Summary:

Current law, as established in the case of Dynamex Operations W. v. Superior Court (2018) 4 Cal.5th 903 (Dynamex), creates a presumption that a worker who performs services for a hirer is an employee for purposes of claims for wages and benefits arising under wage orders issued by the Industrial Welfare Commission. Current law requires a 3-part test, commonly known as the "ABC" test, to determine if workers are employees or independent contractors for those purposes. This bill would repeal the above-described provisions that codify the ABC test. The bill would declare that its purpose is to suspend and nullify the California Supreme Court's decision in Dynamex and provide that this decision does not apply for purposes of California law.

CALAFCO Comments: Of interest to CALAFCO because of its potential effect on operations. 1/25/2024, bill introduced. AB 1928 would repeal the provisions that were enacted by the passage

of AB 5 in 2019. Known as the Gig Worker law, AB 5 reclassified which workers could be considered as contractors. A limited number of professional categories were set aside and excluded from the law. However, those not included in the exclusions were required, under new reclassification requirements, to be considered as employees regardless of whether they were performing the services in connection to an ongoing business. The shift required CALAFCO to amend its internal practices to re-classify its contractors to employees, resulting in increased costs, as well as extra reporting requirements.

SB 537 (Becker D) Open meetings: multijurisdictional, cross-county agencies: teleconferences.

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Summary:

Current law, until January 1, 2024, authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use alternate teleconferencing provisions during a proclaimed state of emergency or in other situations related to public health that exempt a legislative body from the general requirements (emergency provisions) and impose different requirements for notice, agenda, and public participation, as prescribed. The emergency provisions specify that they do not require a legislative body to provide a physical location from which the public may attend or comment. Current law, until January 1, 2026, authorizes the legislative body of a local agency to use alternative teleconferencing in certain circumstances related to the particular member if at least a quorum of its members participate from a singular physical location that is open to the public and situated within the agency's iurisdiction and other requirements are met, including restrictions on remote participation by a member of the legislative body. These circumstances include if a member shows "just cause," including for a childcare or caregiving need of a relative that requires the member to participate remotely. This bill would expand the circumstances of "just cause" to apply to the situation in which an immunocompromised child, parent, grandparent, or other specified relative requires the member to participate remotely. The bill would authorize the legislative body of a multijurisdictional, cross-county agency, as specified, to use alternate teleconferencing provisions if the eligible legislative body has adopted an authorizing resolution, as specified. The bill would also require the legislative body to provide a record of attendance of the members of the legislative body, the number of community members in attendance in the teleconference meeting, and the number of public comments on its internet website within 10 days after a teleconference meeting. as specified. The bill would require at least a quorum of members of the legislative body to participate from one or more physical locations that are open to the public and within the boundaries of the territory over which the local agency exercises jurisdiction.

Position: Watch
Subject: Brown Act

CALAFCO Comments: This is a spotholder bill that states an intent to expand local government's access to hold public meetings through teleconferencing and remote access.

3/22/2023: was amended and fleshed out to add teleconferencing provisions to allow legislative bodies of multijurisdictional agencies to meet remotely. Multijurisdictional agencies are defined as boards, commissions, or advisory bodies of a multijurisdictional, cross county agency, which is composed of appointed representatives from more than one county, city, city and county, special district, or a joint powers entity.

The bill is sponsored bu Peninsula Clean Energy, a community choice aggregator with a board comprised of local elected officials from the County of San Mateo and its 20 cities, as well as the City of Los Banos.

4/24/2023: The bill was amended to further clarify definitions and the requirements needed for members of an eligible legislative body to meet remotely.

The bill passed Senate Judiciary on 5/2/23, and had its third reading in the Senate on 5/30/2023. 7/12/23: The bill passed the Assembly Local Government Committee.

Amended on August 14, 2023, to require eligible legislative bodies that receive compensation to

participate from a physical location that is open to the public.

9/14/2023, the bill was moved into the inactive file.

SB 768 (Caballero D) California Environmental Quality Act: State Air Resources Board: vehicle miles traveled: study.

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Summary:

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires a lead agency to prepare a mitigated negative declaration for a project that may have a significant effect on the environment if revisions in the project would avoid or mitigate that effect and there is no substantial evidence that the project, as revised, would have a significant effect on the environment. Current law requires the Office of Planning and Research to prepare, develop, and transmit to the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency for certification and adoption proposed revisions to guidelines establishing criteria for determining the significance of transportation impacts of projects within transit priority areas to promote the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, the development of multimodal transportation networks, and a diversity of land uses. Current law creates the State Air Resources Board as the state agency charged with coordinating efforts to attain and maintain ambient air quality standards, to conduct research into the causes of and solution to air pollution, and to systematically attack the serious problem caused by motor vehicles, which is the major source of air pollution in many areas of the state. Existing law authorizes the state board to do those acts as may be necessary for the proper execution of the powers and duties granted to, and imposed upon, the state board. This bill would require the state board, by January 1, 2026, to conduct and submit to the Legislature a study on how vehicle miles traveled is used as a metric for measuring transportation impacts pursuant to CEQA, as specified.

Subject: CEQA

CALAFCO Comments: Introduced as a spotholder bill that noted an intent to enact subsequent legislation that would create a new transportation impact analysis for rural areas for purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act.

3/22/2023: The bill was amended and would add language into the Public Resource Code to provide that a public agency, in approving or carrying out certain types of projects, is not required to issue a statement of overriding consideration for significant effects on the environment identified by a project's vehicle miles traveled if the lead agency has imposed all feasible mitigation measures on the project and it finds no feasible alternatives to the project.

Failed to meet deadlines and now a 2 year bill that cannot be acted upon until January, 2024.

1/11/2024: Gutted and Amended. Topic now specific to a study by the state regarding vehicle miles traveled in CEQA studies. Continuing to monitor for any detrimental changes to CEQA but, at this time, bill is not a concern to CALAFCO.

SB 865 (Laird D) Municipal water districts: automatic exclusion of cities.

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Summary:

Current law authorizes a governing body of a municipal water district to adopt an ordinance excluding any territory annexed to a metropolitan water district organized under the Metropolitan Water District Act, if the territory is annexed prior to the effective date of the formation of the municipal water district. Current law requires the Secretary of State to issue a certificate reciting the passage of the ordinance and the exclusion of the area from the municipal water district within

10 days of receiving a certified copy of the ordinance. This bill would extend the number of days the Secretary of State has to issue a certificate to 14 days.

Position: Neutral

Subject: Annexation Proceedings

CALAFCO Comments: Existing law authorizes a governing body of a municipal water district may adopt an ordinance excluding any territory annexed to a metropolitan water district organized under the Metropolitan Water District Act, providing that the territory is annexed prior to the effective date of the formation of the municipal water district. If that happens, the Secretary of State must, within 10 days of receiving a certified copy, issue a certificate reciting the passage of the ordinance that excludes the area from the municipal water district. This bill would extend the Secretary of State's window to issue that certificate from 10 to 14 days.

Failed to meet deadlines and now a 2 year bill that cannot be acted upon until January, 2024.

YEAR 1 END

2023 marked the end of the first-year of this two year legislative cycle. During the year, a total of 3,030 bills were introduced – 1,974 in the Assembly and 1,056 in the Senate. Of those, CALAFCO reviewed nearly all at least once, tracked 21 bills, and took formal positions on 7 bills.

Support positions were taken by CALAFCO on AB 1753 (Assembly Local Government Committee) which was CALAFCO's Omnibus bill, SB 360 (Blakespear) regarding the California Coastal Commission membership, and SB 878, 879, and 880, the Senate Governance and Finance Committee annual validations.

Positions in Opposition were taken on AB 399 (Boerner) County Water Authority Act, AB 530 (Boerner) the first iteration of the County Water Authority Act bill that missed deadlines, and AB 918 (Garcia) the Imperial County Healthcare District.

The call for legislative proposals went out in July and culminated in the receipt of five new Omnibus proposals. To be Omnibus material, the proposal must seek to institute minor or technical changes that are not of concern to other stakeholders.

The collection of Omnibus proposals was

submitted to the Assembly Local Government Committee Consultant for the 2024 session. However, after review and stakeholder outreach, the Committee Consultant approved only one proposal to move forward.

Consequently, CALAFCO starts 2024 with 10 active bills in tracking (all currently marked as watch, neutral or no position), and an Omnibus bill. Thank you to Joe Serrano (Santa Cruz) for spearheading the Omnibus effort.

NEW LAWS

AB 1753 (ALGC) CALAFCO's Omnibus bill adds two new provisions. The first addition is to Government Code Section 56658(d) where a cross reference to existing Revenue and Taxation Code Section 99 was added. The second change is to GC Sec. 56882, changes "mail" to "transmit" and adds subsection (b), which requires a confirmation of receipt for resolutions transmitted by email or electronic means.

SB 360 (Blakespear) California Coastal
Commission - Allows members of JPAs,

Governments to serve on the Coastal Commission.

AB 557 (Hart) Brown Act teleconferencing - Revises the rules for teleconferencing during a proclaimed emergency by removing the sunset date, removing references to social distancing, and extending the time between legislative findings of a continued emergency from the previous 30-day period to 45 days. Does not affect regular teleconferencing rules.
