The Farmworker Advisory Commission brings visibility to issues that disproportionately affect farmworkers, advises the Board of Supervisors on policies and initiatives, serves as a forum for the community, and advocates/supports the farmworker community.

- The Education and Outreach committee is planning another Know Your Rights training on 25<sup>th</sup> of June. This training will be in Pescadero and will focus on W-4 forms.
- Rogelio Nabor-Martinez:
  - Del Campo Al Cambio is organizing a community event on May 10, 2024, from 5:30-8:30pm at 350 Stage Rd, Pescadero. Community members will learn about Campo Al Cambio, DCAC'S Advocacy Work, and more. It will also be a Mother's Day Celebration with BBQ.
- Nicolas Romero-Gonzalez:
  - Del Campo Al Cambio has been working and advocating for affordable housing with Puente's support. They are exploring options for housing in Pescadero. Nicolas acknowledges the work that the members of Del Campo Al Cambio have done.
- Jorge Sanchez:
  - Spoke on the lack of affordable housing for farmworkers. On Tuesday May 14<sup>th</sup>, there will be a meeting by the Planning Committee to discuss the 555 Kelly Avenue affordable housing project.
