HCH/FH Intro

Mission: The San Mateo County Health Care for the Homeless/Farmworker Health (HCH/FH) Program is dedicated to serving homeless and farmworker individuals and families by ensuring access to comprehensive primary health care, dental health care, and behavioral health services in a supportive, welcoming, and accessible environment.

Funding: Funded by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to provide and increase access critical health services through various touch points within San Mateo County.

Grant

Grant to expand health center operating hours.

Goal

Increase access to primary care by extending service hours and reducing barriers.

Key Requirements

Increase hours by 1+ hour/week, demonstrate community need, and offer in-person appointments during expanded hours.



Mobile Clinic at Coastside Clinic or Half Moon Bay Library

Days/Number of Hours: Sunday's, 4 hours (11AM-3PM or 12PM-4PM)

Type of Care: Adult Primary Care

Target Population: Farmworkers and their dependents

Purpose: Increase access to care for those that are not able to receive care during the current clinics' schedule.

Proposed Referral Process: Outreach workers and case managers can call in and the clinic can assign a farmworker to a "slot" for the day. We will still take drop ins too.

Advertised: Through CBO partners, Field Medicine, SMMC providers, HMB Library, etc.

- Are farmworkers available on Sundays to receive care? Is this the best day to add to the schedule?
 - Coastside Clinic is already open Monday Saturday
- We can commit to a 4 hour time block, is there a preference for 11AM-3PM or 12PM-4PM? Other time block?
