Who are we?

What is DACA?

Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA)

- Administrative policy created by the Obama Administration in 2012
- Provides temporary protection from deportation, work authorization, and ability to travel under limited circumstances
- Does not lead to U.S. citizenship
- Have to renew every two years

Who is Benefiting from DACA?

How many people have DACA?

- **580,000** persons with DACA nationwide
- **183,000** in California
- **11,000** in the SF Metro area

Who is Benefiting from DACA?

DACA recipients possess advanced levels of education

- 47% with some college education nationwide
- 67% with some college education in SF Metro area

DACA recipients play a significant role in the workforce

- 94.1% in the workforce

What is happening with DACA?

Texas v. United States

- We knew DACA was vulnerable from the day it was first introduced
- Lawsuit challenging the legality of DACA pending before Fifth Circuit
- After Fifth Circuit ruling, can appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court
- If U.S. Supreme Court decides to take on case, ruling could happen sometime in **Summer or Fall 2025**

How should we prepare for a possible DACA termination?

Need to prepare now in case DACA ends next year

- Get legal consultation
- Having follow-up discussions before filing
- Some filings can take a while

Overview of Employment Based Immigration Options

- Existing law allows for employers to sponsor an employee to obtain a different form of lawful status
- Employment-based options:
 - Green Cards
 - Non-immigrant Visas

Common Employment Based Immigration Options: Green Cards

- PERM (Labor Certification)
 - Filed with Department of Labor
 - For most green card applications, PERM must be filed first
 - Advertise job to show that no U.S. worker is “able, willing, qualified, and available” for job
- Green Card: Some categories don't require educational degree

Common Employment Based Immigration Options: Nonimmigrant Visas

- H-1B
 - At least a bachelor's degree or its equivalent
 - Specialty Occupation: Degree and job must match
 - 65,000-85,000 visas a year so generally must enter lottery
 - *Colleges and universities, and certain government and non-profits are exempt from lottery

Biden's Policy Announcement: Easing the Nonimmigrant Visa Process for U.S. College Graduates

- June 18
 - Easing D-3 waiver to be able to obtain nonimmigrant visa
 - Individuals with a degree from a U.S. institution of higher education and who come to work for a U.S. employer related to their education, are considered to have a positive effect on U.S. public interests.
 - Expedited

Biden's Policy Announcement: Easing the Nonimmigrant Visa Process for U.S. College Graduates

- June 18
 - Easing D-3 waiver to be able to obtain nonimmigrant visa
 - Individuals with a degree from a U.S. institution of higher education and who come to work for a U.S. employer related to their education, are considered to have a positive effect on U.S. public interests.
 - Expedited

Statistics

- Over 300 consultation in a few months
 - At least 54% are potentially eligible for an employment-based option
