Face masks required at Pride Center

Based on the recent notification from San Mateo County Health that we are experiencing a high level of COVID-19 infection, the Pride Center is temporarily reinstating our on-site mask policy effective immediately. We will remove the temporary mandate once the virus levels return to normal/as we are updated.

As a reminder, we have face masks and COVID tests available on-site if you need them. We also continue to use air purifiers, sanitize surfaces regularly throughout the day, and keep windows open for increased air flow and circulation.

Transcending Through Art: An Expressive Arts Therapy Group for Transgender/Nonbinary/Gender Exansive Teens (Ages 13 – 19)

This is an 8-week expressive arts therapy group for gender expansive youth, ages 13-19, who identify as Transgender, Nonbinary, Gender Fluid, Gender Non-conforming, Gender Creative and Questioning teens. All skill levels welcome, no prior experience required. Art supplies will be provided. Additionally, participants are invited to bring their own supplies.

What can I gain from this group?

- Nurturing Joy & Euphoria through: Creative exploration of identity and selfexpression
- Processing emotions outside the body

Suggested Project Name: Inclusive and Connected Community Campaign

The impetus for the "visibility" project came from Commissioner Jana Rickerson who went to several large community events and was concerned that when she introduced herself as a member of our commission people were surprised that there even was such a thing. Below is a script for a two-minute public comment for commissioners to modify and use during the early phase of this project. When we go to City Council meetings to introduce ourselves and learn how to do this well, this will prepare us for helping volunteer ambassadors to do this themselves. I've personalized this one for me in Daly City. Naturally, we'll have each commissioner personalize their own. As part of this first phase, we need to create a page on the LGBTQIA+ Commission website that introduces the campaign and includes paragraphs describing our commission, the Pride Initiative, the Pride Center, and Coast Pride with links to each for more details. We should be able to put that together quickly and in time for commissioners to start speaking at City Council meetings in October.

This is just step one in a huge project. Steps two and one will involve creating scripts for our ambassadors to cover many different issues for the LGBTQIA+ people they represent.

A two-minute speech typically consists of 250 to 360 words depending on the speaker's pace. I believe a good 2-minute public comment should include three components:

- Introducing yourself to establish why you care
- A description of the issue you're concerned about
- A personal story
- A call to action

DRAFT 2 Minute Public Comment to City Council Meetings

Good Evening. My name is <<insert name>> and <<add a 1 - 2 sentence bio about yourself>>. Thank you for flying the Pride/Progress flag in June. That symbol of inclusion helps me and many others feel welcome and valued here. That's important at a time when our nation's Surgeon General, Vivek Hallegere Murthy, and county government have recognized loneliness and isolation as an epidemic harming our mental and physical health, especially among our youth and seniors. The antidote to loneliness is connection so today I'm here to ask you to help the LGBTQIA+ community connect. We are blessed to have a County Pride Center, Coast Pride, a County Pride Initiative, many businesses and other organizations supporting LGBTQIA+ people, and a County LGBTQIA+ Commission, all offering community connections, services, and advocacy. I serve on the LGBTQIA+ Commission and we have created an Inclusive and Connected Community Campaign. We're asking you to shine a light on that

campaign and share the link to our information in your newsletters, social media, and emails. I've sent you all an email with details. Please ask your Council staff to schedule a formal presentation from the LGBTQIA+ Commission about our history, accomplishments, and work plan to help everyone in this city feel more affirmed, included, and connected. When we take that next step to become a more equitable community, together we all thrive. Thank you.

- Assumptions:
 - Volunteers have been recruited and trained and we have the info requested below.
 - Training includes what to say at meetings.
 - We are only mobilizing for attendance at City Council meetings for now.
 - o The mobilization committee is responsible for the calendar.
- What does mobilization look like for a volunteer?
 - Validate that they're trained; answer any questions. Do they feel equipped to do what we're asking them to do?
 - Get them information about the dates and times of the city council meetings for their city
 - Invite them to commit to a date and a topic (an "engagement"?) that will include at least one question.
 - o Arrange for a commission member to be present at their first engagement.
 - o Follow up with them after, to make sure the engagement happened.
 - Maybe make a survey for them to fill out?
 - Name
 - When they attended
 - The topic they addressed
 - Any questions they asked
 - Comments/observations about the experience
 - Follow up conversation/debrief (by the commissioner who attended, or the commissioner responsible for their city)
 - Could schedule the next engagement at this time
 - If not, ask when to contact them again
 - o End-of-year
 - Thank you
 - Commitment for the coming year
 - Maybe a volunteer appreciation party?
- What data do we need to collect from volunteers in order to mobilize? (for the recruitment committee)
 - Name
 - o City
 - o Email

- Phone number
- Preferred contact method (email, text, phone call)
- Validate that they're willing to speak at city council meetings
- How often will we contact them (after recruitment and training)? What will those contacts look like?
 - Initial contact within a week of training (need notification from the training folks that their training has happened)
 - Need to track if someone says "Interested, but can't until summer time" or something like. Need to put this into some kind of database. ("Next contact date") And hopefully automate notifications about this.
 - o Reminder a week before a scheduled engagement
 - o Goal: set up an engagement
- What do we want to report back about this meeting at the next Commission meeting?
 - o Report the notes above
