This is something by which you could make recommendation to the Board of Supervisors about what additional resources or jail keeper training might do so that these things don't happen again.

Chair Salahuddin, Vice Chair McClure, and Commissioners:

Mindful of the turmoil in the Sheriff's Office, we believe that ICAC can play a positive role in its authority as advisory to the Board of Supervisors on matters relating to the Sheriff's Office .

Specifically, we suggest that ICAC has the opportunity to help address the current crisis in the Sheriff's Office by:

- **Reviewing the findings from Judge LaDoris Cordell's upcoming report and making recommendations to the Board of Supervisors** in its role as an advisory body.
- **Requesting that the Board of Supervisors keep Judge Cordell on after the release of her report to oversee implementation of any recommendations.**
- **Looking at the concerns of deputies about deputy well-being and developing recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.** These issues were central to the deputy complaints about mandatory overtime in the jail and also about deputies being pulled off of street patrol in order to do transport and court support.

We hope that ICAC can take the opportunity to consider these suggestions at your November 16 retreat.
