Confined Animal Technical Advisory Committee

Mission

Statement: To assist in achieving the objectives of Chapter 1 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code (Zoning Annex) establishing confined animal regulations.

Authority: Ordinance No. 04070 adopted November 6, 2001 (Zoning Annex § 7700.11).

Membership: Nine members who are knowledgeable in keeping confined animals and potential impact on surrounding properties and the environment. Of the nine members, five members and one alternate member, with experience and proficiency in keeping and caring for confined animals (Caretaker). Preferred skills include a thorough understanding of animal behavior and needs, as well as facility management and operations. The five members shall include at least one commercial stable operator and one private stable operator. Three members and one alternate member with an academic background or experience in environmental studies, environmental planning/land management, or resource protection (Environmental). Preferred skills include water quality protection, erosion and sediment control, and animal waste management. One member with knowledge and experience in protecting public health from potential impacts due to confined animals, i.e., environmental health expertise (Environmental Health). A five-member quorum is required for a meeting, with at least one member representing each of three categories identified above.

Term: Three years; maximum 12 years

Duties: To provide pre-application guidance to Confined Animal Permit applicants; advise the Planning Commission and the Board of Supervisors on Confined Animal Permit applications; review site management plans and propose best management practices; assist in resolving illegal and non-conforming confined animal situations; and provide general educational outreach on facility management.

Duties: To evaluate, make recommendations and initiate activities regarding: current responses of law enforcement, the judicial system, health care services and community resources; local government efforts to reduce domestic and family violence; public awareness and public education necessary to effect prevention activities; the collection of statistics and data; the adequacy of federal, state and local laws; and the need for services for those who are victims of domestic and family violence. The Council will develop an annual work plan and submit an annual report to the Board of Supervisors.

Mental Health Board

Mission

Statement: Oversight of mandated community mental health services.

Authority: Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5604.

Membership: 22 persons, including 19 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors as required by Welfare & Institutions Code §5604, one member of the Board of Supervisors, and two members of the Youth Commission. The appointed membership should reflect the ethnic diversity of the client population in the county. Fifty percent of the appointed members shall be consumers or the parents, spouses, siblings, or adult children of consumers, who are receiving or have received mental health services. At least 20 percent of the appointed members shall be consumers, and at least 20 percent of the appointed members shall be families of consumers. The remainder of the appointments shall include individuals who have knowledge and experience of the mental health system. Consistent with Welfare & Institutions Code §5604(d), no member of the board or his or her spouse shall be a full-time or part-time county employee of a county mental health service, an employee of the State Department of Mental Health, or an employee of, or a paid member of the governing body of, a mental health contract agency. "Mental health service" includes any service directed toward early intervention in, or alleviation or prevention of, mental disorder, including, but not limited to, diagnosis, evaluation, treatment, personal care, day care, respite care, special living arrangements, community skill training, sheltered employment, socialization, case management, transportation, information, referral, consultation and community services.

Term: Three years; maximum 12 years

Duties: Reviews and evaluates the County's mental health needs, services, facilities and

special programs, agreements dealing with mental health; advises the Board of Supervisors and the Mental Health Director of any aspect of the local mental health program; reviews and approves procedures used to ensure citizen and professional involvement at all stages of the planning process; submits an annual report to the Board of Supervisors on the needs and performance of the County's mental health system.
