IX. Proposed Activities for 2016 (All)

- a. Probation Violations—what are youth being violated for and how are violations dealt with in San Mateo versus other counties
- b. Mental Health—collaborate with Public Health to see how mental health correlates with juvenile delinquency and where JJDC could help (Thadaney)
- c. School Mental Health—is there sufficient Mental Health training for teachers, e.g., Mental Health First Aid Initiative, in the schools? (MacAvoy and Thadaney)
