  - Up to \$10K for up to three years for Latinx college juniors and seniors majoring in a STEM + internship with a tech company + mentorship.
  - 427 scholars to date.





## SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED BY DECLARED MAJORS





- Latinos account for 26% of the Silicon Valley population. The Latino community will double in population in the next 30 years, and yet, less than 3% of them are in the high-tech industry in Silicon Valley.
- Early exposure to STEM education is critical as it prepares students for life, regardless of the profession they choose to follow. Computer and IT jobs in the U.S. are projected to grow 12% by 2024, faster than the average for all other occupations. These jobs will be available to the Hispanic Community only if this population is college and career ready.
