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ACTION MINUTES

Draft Monday April 12, 2021

3. Oral Communications

- Krystlyn Geidt, President & CEO of the Coastside Half Moon Bay Chamber of Commerce, shared about the development of the Coastside Recovery Initiative, a partnership with the Chamber, the City of Half Moon Bay, and San Mateo County that focuses on economic recovery from Covid-19. The group is led by their Recovery Task Force, which recently selected major areas of focus, including the environment/agriculture.
- <u>Rita Mancera</u>, Executive Director of Puente de la Costa Sur, shared that Puente is seeking applicants for a new position of Housing Advocate and that Puente will host a last vaccine clinic on April 23, 2021 for anyone 18+ years of age.
- Kerry Burke, a land use consultant, shared that the City of Half Moon Bay's updated Local Coastal Plan, which was developed with the input of the local agriculture community, will be heard by the California Coastal Commission on April 15, 2021.

7. <u>Informational Item</u> – Presentation by the Midpeninsula Open Space District (MidPen) on protected coastal open space & agricultural lands within the District.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

No action required. The presentation was given by Mike Williams, Omar Smith, and Lewis Reed of MidPen and provided an overview of current boundaries, properties, and projects within the District. The Committee discussed: protecting agricultural and ranching lands from the public, protecting native grasslands, updates to MidPen's predation policy, and fire protection measures including MidPen's Wildland Fire Resiliency Program.

Member of the public Kerry Burke raised clarifying questions about the predation policy and fire protection measures.

8. <u>Continued Committee Review of Draft Farm Stand Guidelines.</u> Planning Staff is requesting input and feedback on these Draft Guidelines. The Guidelines were composed with input from the Agricultural Ombudsman, Environmental Health and the Planning Department. The Draft Guidelines were previously discussed at the March 8, 2021 AAC meeting.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

Committee discussions focused on types of farm products proposed in the draft guidelines, the need for a diversity of sellable crops to make farm stands successful, which may be difficult to source from only San Mateo County produce; the challenge of using a density credit for a permanent farm stand and a limit on the number of farm stands per property as an alternative control point; concerns about paved parking and associated drainage plans; that value-added products permitted should be related to agriculture; and how to track farm stand activity without a specific farm stand permit.

Member of the public Kerry Burke discussed using trailers/structures with wheels for farm stands, concerns about using density credits for farm stands, potential fee reductions, and a desire to highlight San Mateo County grown crops at farm stands.

San Mateo County Agricultural Ombudsman, Adria Arko, provided background on the process to develop these draft guidelines, offered framing questions for the discussion, and provided clarification regarding alignment with existing Planned Agricultural District (PAD) and Local Coastal Plan (LCP) regulations.

Committee Secretary Lauren Silberman moved and Committee Member Bill Cook seconded a motion to continue discussions on this agenda item at the next committee meeting.

Motion carried 8-0-0 with 3 members absent.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

No action required. Committee discussions focused on types of farm stands and performance measures proposed in the draft guidelines, farmer's market regulations; Produce Dealer's Licenses and Certified Producer's Certificates that require that farm stands sell crops produced on that parcel along with other's produce, including foraged produce; potential for permitting produce from all of California and/or the west coast, labeling San Mateo County grown crops; using alternative parcels for farm stands; registration processes as opposed to permit processes; options for County enforcement of the proposed guidelines with or without a permit/registration process; potential of using the annual crop report to track farm stands; and an opposition to requiring a density credit for permanent farm stands.

San Mateo County Agricultural Ombudsman, Adria Arko, provided background on the process to develop the draft guidelines, offered framing questions for the discussion, and will circulate discussion notes to the committee.
